2011 was a successful year for the Coalition. We saw growth and launched a new organizational infrastructure to better fulfill our mission and improve accessibility and communication between members, the board, staff, and the community at large. Our committees were streamlined into

the Food, Watershed, and Built Environment Councils. Project initiation and management now moves forward from the ground up.

An Advisory Board was established drawing from leaders and experts in the community. We moved into our first official office in downtown Ojai and opened as a Resource Center – for all members of the community to access information on sustainable issues and topics. Our supporting membership more than doubled due to the success of our year-end membership drive, which included a \$10,000.00 matching challenge.

We are a 'think globally, act locally' driven organization with the belief that we must start with ourselves and our local government, for that is the place where we have the most control and power to make a difference. Our challenge as a young non-profit is to decide what projects and efforts have the most impact and make the best use of our resources. We constantly explore what and how we operate and will continue to do so as we grow into the future.

Whether rolling up our sleeves to pull trash from our creeks, or present to the Ojai city council our recommendation to pass a single-use carryout bag ordinance, we have a core of folks that show up to get the job done. If you don't open and read our monthly communications, we encourage you to do so. We get regular kudos for the look and content of our e-news. We are constantly on the move and want to share and engage you! Please sign on to our volunteer staff list to stay connected to our activities. educational events, showing up for planning commission or city council meetings, and working at the Resource Center.

It's great to have an annual e-waste collection event for the community, but when we collected 40,000 lbs. for the third year in a row in a half a day in our small community, we knew we needed to add an awareness about keeping electronics a year or two longer or ways to donate to those in need. We do this through public service announcements.

Earth Day is always a fun event with music and lots of food. The challenge is to incorporate messages about ways to reduce our individual and common ecological footprint that stick. One way was to invite the BAG MONSTER. Another was initiating the message of our May Water Awareness Month, that we can greatly reduce our water footprint through

home and community water efficiency and conservation. Several dozen residents attended our workshops and round-table discussions, and took advantage of free water efficiency products displayed at city hall and the library.

When Robin Graham expressed a willingness to take on a community garden project, but needed a 501(c)3 umbrella, we opened our arms for this much needed community service. Robin and her project team signed on 11 gardeners in this first year, producing local food and sequestering more carbon.

All in all year five of our short career was chock-full of activity, new relationships, and enough community support to 'hire' two part time staff members who had been working on a 'consulting' basis. To become a community or support-



From the time Robin was a toddler, if she wanted alone-time with her father she needed to be out in his vegetable garden keeping him company as he worked. She loved the feel of the warm soil filled with worms, the sound of bees, the investigation of bugs, the sweet taste of fresh strawberries and the companionship experienced in

the garden environment. In 2010, Robin Graham decided she wanted to provide a space in the Ojai Valley for others to come and experience a community of gardening, and Help of Ojai offered up the perfect one acre site at their West Campus. In early 2011, the Coalition adopted the now named Ojai Valley of the Moon Community Garden (Garden), as a pilot project under the Food Council. With the help of Keith Brock, the Garden was born and eleven community members participated in the fun. By fall 2011 the Garden had been adopted as an approved site for hands-on training for UC Master Gardeners in Ventura County. In addition, in 2011 the Garden expanded to include an area for the production of fresh organic vegetables for donation to the Help of Ojai Senior Lunch Program.
