- · Toilets must be functional and clean
- · Fiberglass showers and tubs
- Metal or cast iron bathtubs
- No shower doors, unless new

Brick:

- Clean brick
- · New or used landscape masonry products

Cabinets:

- Must be in working condition
- · Prefer them assembled

Ceiling Fans:

- Must be in working condition
- · Prefer them unassembled

Carpet:

- Prefer new
- Will take used if less than 5 years old and in very good condition

Doors:

- Interior & exterior, no holes, good quality only
- · Storm doors in excellent condition only
- French doors that are not broken or have fogged glass

Drywall/Sheetrock:

- 1/2 sheets or more only
- All thicknesses

Electrical Fixtures:

- Switches
- Breakers
- Breaker boxes
- Receptacles
- Switch/outlet covers

Glass:

- Thicker table top or round edge
- · No plate glass accepted

Furniture:

- Wood or similar
- Upholstered items in good condition
- Sofas, loveseats, occasional chairs
- Dining room
- Bedroom sets No mattresses accepted
- Lawn furniture

Hardware:

- · Bolts, nuts, screws, nails sorted only
- Handles, pulls, latches, cabinet hinges, door hinges

Household Items:

- Containers, totes, baskets, trunks, wooden crates
- Framed art and paintings
- Decorative mirrors
- Musical instruments no pianos
- Toy boxes
- Dog houses

Lawn & Garden:

- Mowers & trimmers must be in working condition, no repairs needed
- Rakes, shovels, sledge hammers, etc.
- · Wheelbarrows, wagons, leaf bags
- Hoses and hose caddies
- Outdoor lawn furniture
- Landscaping tools
- Barbecue grills

Light Fixtures:

- Ceiling fans working, clean and blades removed; hardware must be included

Lumber:

- Dimensional lumber and sheet material such as plywood and paneling
- · Must be 4 ft or greater in length
- Must be free of nails, screws and brads
- No water damage, mold/mildew or rotted materials
- Lumber and trim must be at least 6 ft in length

Paint and Stain:

- Commercial donations preferred
- · Unopened cans only
- Must be full, non-rusted cans less than two years old

Siding:

- Vinyl only in box, unused
- No asbestos siding accepted

Plumbing Fixtures:

- PVC
- Faucets new or used
- Copper pipe
- Metal piping

Roofing:

- Shingles
- Roofing paper
- Decking
- Must be unopened and in original package, otherwise subject to approval by HHFH staff

Shelving:

• Metal shop, wooden, industrial and closet

Sinks:

- Kitchen, washtubs and laundry
- Vanity tops with cabinet base only

Tile:

- New tile only
- · Bathroom wall or floor

Tools:

- Yard tools, shop tools, brooms, etc.
- Power tools, good working order
- Woodworking items

Windows:

- Will only pick up new windows
- Used windows must be brought into ReStore
- Wood sash windows
- No storm windows accepted

For items NOT ACCEPTED by Heartland Habitat ReStore, please consider the following agencies:

Batteries: Alkaline batteries may be disposed of in trash. Laptop, cell phone and automobile batteries, call Johnson County Environmental Department at (913) 715-6900 for drop-off location and times.
