FEATURING WIDELY KNOWN RESEARCHERS



Bruce Perry, M.D., Ph.D., is the Senior Fellow of the ChildTrauma Academy, a not-for-profit organization based in Houston (www.ChildTrauma.org) and an adjunct professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Northwestern University School of Medicine in Chicago. Over the last 30 years, Dr. Perry has been an active teacher, clinician and researcher in children's mental health and the neurosciences, holding a variety of academic positions.



Robert F. Anda, M.D., M.S., has designed and conducted epidemiologic studies for more than 20 years. He has written more than 100 peer-reviewed and government publications as well as several book chapters and currently is a senior researcher at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in Atlanta. He was the Co-Principal Investigator for the ACE (Adverse Childhood Events) Study, which links health outcomes in later life to early trauma. He played the principal role in the study's design, subsequent analysis of the data, and preparation of its numerous scientific publications. He frequently is invited to speak about the ACE Study and has presented its findings at congressional briefings.
