Dear Representative Peter King,

We invite you to recall our nation's history. During World War II, Japanese Americans were deprived of their rights and forced into internment camps. As a nation we distrusted their loyalty and commitment to the nation. The McCarthy hearings were another shameful spectacle altering and destroying the lives of many Americans. Catholics were once demonized as threats to democracy beholden to a foreign power. Jews and African Americans have faced centuries of suspicion and prejudice. And today, Muslim-Americans in many communities face fierce opposition when they propose to build a mosque to worship peacefully. Ever growing number of Muslims are victims of hate crimes. This bigotry and discrimination, rooted in fear and ignorance is corrosive to the soul of our nation.

Just last month, our nation was shocked by a savage shooting spree in Arizona. That brazen attack killed and injured fellow Americans, including your colleague, Congresswoman Gabrielle Giffords. The nation mourned together in the wake of that painful tragedy. Leaders of both parties have called for an elevated civic dialogue transcending fear-mongering and polarization. Your proposed hearings are unworthy of that noble goal.

As religious leaders and people of faith, we stand together to express our profound concern about the Congressional hearings you have proposed to investigate the Muslim-American community. We fear this effort will only further divide our community and undermine our nation's highest ideals. We urge you to cancel these hearings.

Instead we ask you initiate a more constructive approach and convene a dialogue among faith leaders, law enforcement and elected officials. It is with a spirit of goodwill and sincere hope that we propose beginning such an initiative with you.
