The meeting has been set so that working individuals will be able to attend and hear about the Fall Term from the teachers who will be teaching the classes. The Braselton Curriculum Committee has done an excellent job of recruiting superb teachers for the Braselton Fall Term. BULLI students have found it quite helpful to attend the registration meetings to learn more about the courses. Students often-add-additional courses when they hear the fantastic line-up. You are not required to register for BULLI or sign up for classes at the meeting, but we certainly hope that you do!

Official registration lasts through Thursday, August 30. Those registering after Thursday will only be able to register for those classes not closed out.

For the 2012-2013 academic year, membership for BULLI is a low \$130.00. You may take as many classes as you wish at an additional fee of \$35.00 per class, and if you're a member, you may take courses on either campus or on both! The academic year runs from August through July of 2013, so becoming a member now gives you four great quarters of lifelong learning opportunities. Classes for Fall through Spring Terms are open to BULLI members only, so plan to sign up today!

FALL TERM COURSES – GAINESVILLE SEPTEMBER 24– NOVEMBER 9, 2012

THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION – How much do you really know about the American Revolution? What was happening in the colony of Georgia at the time of the Revolution and who were the major players? This course will provide a brief overview of the events and times that defined the birth of a nation. We will examine especially the war in the South. Monday 9:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m., Glen Kyle is a military historian who has taught previously for BULLI. He is the managing director of the Northeast Georgia History Center.

SHAKE IT UP, SHAPE UP WITH ZUMBA – Zumba fuses Latin and international music with toning and fitness moves that target arms, legs and help strengthen your core. In this class you will learn the basic steps of salsa, merengue, samba and cha-cha, and then put them all together in a fun workout that is easy to follow, gets you moving, and will definitely put a smile on your face and a zing in your step! Monday, 10:45 a.m. – 12:15 p.m., Sandra Carnet retired from serving as chief public relations officer for 28 years at Georgia State University. She became a certified Zumba instructor, teaching classes at local YMCAs and at First Methodist Church.

WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT... OPERA? – Do you love opera or do you hate it, or do you just think you hate it? Have you ever really listened? This course will look at how to understand and enjoy the opera experience. Beginning with Mozart's "The Magic Flute", you will be led on a journey of 7 opera styles and their representative operas. We will conclude with Wagner's "The Ring" and an in depth examination of "Die Walkure." Monday, 1:00 p.m. – 2:30 p.m., Steve Coldiron is Associate Minister of Music at First Baptist Church. He has been a music minister for 33 years. He has taught previously for BULLI.

POLITICS IN AMERICA – How much do you understand about the political process in America? Many people know very little about how the Electoral College works. This course will examine the debate over the constitutional flaws and strengths of the college. We will look at the best and worst campaigns in American history and take an in depth look at the 2012 Presidential and Georgia elections, and ballot measures. *Monday, 2:45 p.m. – 4:15 p.m., Dr. Heather Casey is associate professor of political science at Brenau and has taught previously for BULLI.*

MURDER AND MAYHEM IN ATLANTA – For many Georgians, the name Wayne Williams is a familiar one. In the late 1970's and early 1980's, a series of murders were committed. At least 28 African-American children, adolescents and young adults were the victims of a serial killer. Wayne Williams was convicted of two of those murders. This course will provide a view of the Atlanta Child Murder case through the eyes of one of the investigators. Tuesday, 9:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m., Jim Procopio served in the FBI for 27 years, 6 months and 11 days. During that time, he worked many fascinating cases, among them the Atlanta child murders, penitentiary murders and the murders at Moore's Ford. He has taught previously for BULLI.

AMERICAN MOMENTS: HISTORY, MEANING AND MYTH – Washington, Crockett, Lincoln, Jesse James and JFK: we know them from history, but do we know their real stories? Come and explore the meanings behind the myths that have evolved around these famous individuals. Tuesday, 10:45 a.m. – 12:15 p.m., Dr. Bruce Morgan holds a Doctor of Ministry degree from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He pastored Griffin First Baptist Church for 30 years until retirement and has taught regularly for BULLI.

MYTHOLOGY: IT'S EVERYWHERE! - Classical mythology exerts an enormous influence on Western Civilization. This course is an introduction to the primary characters and most important stories of classical Greek and Roman mythology. We will look at how the ancient gods, monsters, and heroes are very much alive and active today in the constellations, movies, art, literature, everyday speech, and modern society. Tuesday, 1:00 p.m. -2:30 p.m., LaMerle Loveland is a retired English teacher who has taught several courses for BULLI.

HOW DO YOU DO THAT? Are you frustrated by some seemingly simple procedure when using your computer? Do you know how to take care of your computer to maximize its life? Do you have questions about using the Internet, Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, Picasa or Photostory? What still confuses you about Facebook and other social media? If you have questions, then this class is for you! You bring the questions; we'll provide the answers. *Tuesday, 2:45 p.m. – 4:15 p.m., Kathy Amos is BULLI director and has taught many computer classes for the program.*

THE JEWS: FROM THE EXILE TO ROMAN DESTRUCTION – The purpose of this course is to look at Jewish history and writings during the period from the end of the Hebrew Bible (Old Testament) until the beginning of the New Testament. We will look at traditional historical accounts and the results of modern scholarship and archaeology. Wednesday, 9:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m., Dr. Edward Simmons is an adjunct professor for Gwinnett College and has taught previously for BULLI.

BETTER DRAWING/BETTER PAINTING! This new class is not just your basic drawing class! The course is designed for beginning to advanced students who paint or would like to paint. Learn how to create depth, master perspective issues, and build form

quickly, through a thorough knowledge of drawing principles. Speed up your painting ability and avoid pesky mistakes by simplifying the drawing process. Students will work with both drawing materials and limited amounts of paint (students' choice of oil, acrylic or watercolor; pastel is also acceptable.) Discover how easy it can be to improve a painting through better drawing! Wednesday, 10:45 a.m. – 12:15 p.m., Elizabeth Stallings is a professional fine art artist/art instructor experienced in teaching in a number of art mediums. She has taught for BULLI.

PHILOSOPHICAL PUZZLES — This course will include a brief introduction to the study of philosophy, followed by an investigation into five of the most puzzling questions ever to boggle the mind of human beings. Those questions are: (1) Does God exist? (2) What is the nature of the human mind; (3) Do human beings have free will? (4) How do we know what we know? and (5) How can we tell right from wrong? Wednesday, 1:00-2:30 p.m., Dr. James Sennett has over 20 years experience teaching philosophy and religion at the college level. He has taught previously for BULLI.

EARTHLY DELIGHTS – GARDENING AND MORE – Join a class that will encompass various garden-related topics. Students will learn about raised bed vegetable gardening, creating a bird and butterfly habitat garden, tailoring a landscape for low maintenance (while still maintaining interest and beauty), and also take several tours, one of which will be the bamboo forest within walking distance of Brenau University. *Thursday, 9:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m., Shay Grant holds a Masters of Horticulture from Auburn University and is the owner of Grant Garden Group.*

INNER ORGAN RECITAL II: A FEW NEW SELECTIONS – This course is a continuation of the Spring Organ Recital course (not a prerequisite) and will feature additional organ systems, including basic anatomy and physiology, selected disease processes with some comparative and evolutionary aspects. Thursday, 10:45 a.m. – 12:15 p.m., George Ordway holds a Ph.D. in physiology from the University of Kentucky. He is a retired professor of physiology and taught medical and allied health students for 25 years.

ou must be present to enroll and register; enrollment cannot be done by phone or online for the Fall Term. Please remember that you must fill out a new membership form each academic year. The course will consist of a series of guest speakers from the community and local universities and institutions, with opportunity for class participation. Each speaker is an expert — some nationally recognized — in his or her chosen field. Warning: some will challenge our long held beliefs or the way we think about what we read or hear! Wednesday, 1:00 — 2:30 p.m., Jim Smith is a physicist who is retired from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). He is an adjunct professor at Emory University in the Rollins School of Public Health.

COME ON IN! THE WATERCOLOR'S FINE! – Beginner or seasoned watercolorist – it's still all about the water. How much water? How wet the paper? You'll learn about pigments and how they interact while wet and how your surface is key to successful painting. Thursday, 9:00-10:30 a.m., Kathy Ash has been painting for more than 25 years and has been a BULLI instructor since the program's beginning. She works primarily in oil and watercolors. She teaches beginning to advanced level painting students in her studio in Winder.

WHO WAS THE BEST GENERAL OF THE CIVIL WAR? – This course focuses on eight towering personalities of the war. Most Southerners automatically conclude that Robert E. Lee was the best of the Confederate generals. The Lost Cause Interpretation fostered that conclusion. The interpretation was pushed by Southern writers as part of the resistance to Reconstruction and hinged on turning Lee into a Christ figure. Three leading generals, James Longstreet, William Sherman and Ulysses Grant, thought that Joseph Johnston was a better general than Lee. We will look at Lee's achievements as we consider him along with seven other outstanding generals and reach our own conclusions. Thursday, 6:30 – 8:00 p.m., Dr. Edward Simmons is an adjunct professor for Gwinnett College and has taught previously for BULLI.
