

Over 90% of staff call for NHS top boss to quit.

In an unprecedented response to a staff survey, conducted by *nhs*Managers.net, the leading electronic news, comment and information service for NHS managers; a mix of 1723 medics, nurses, clinical professionals, senior managers and administrators responded to the question; *Is it time for Sir David Nicholson to step down from his role in the NHS?* -**91.6% said yes**.




Responding to the survey, *nhs*Managers.net editor and former Trust

Chairman Roy Lilley said; 'This is a huge blow for Sir David. It is clear he no longer enjoys the support of front-line staff. As stories of quality horrors, bullying and service dislocation emerge it would seem time to recognise Sir David's huge contribution to the NHS in the past but make it clear he is not the man to take the NHS into the future. Politicians insist on the NHS being run in a business like way. If this were a business I think the shareholders would be calling for a new boss and a clean sweep of the Board. I don't see why taxpayers should expect anything less'.
