Homes for All outlines proposed \$50 million investment to prevent family homelessness, create workforce housing

When: Today Thursday, March 7, 2013, 11:00 - 11:45am

Where: State Capitol Room 125

What: Legislation to invest \$50 million to address rising family homelessness and workforce housing shortages was introduced. Advocates will respond to new statewide homeless data released by Wilder Research on March 6.

Facts about Housing and Homelessness

- Approximately 13,100 Minnesotans are homeless on any given night (Wilder Research 2009.)
- 55 percent of homeless Minnesotans are families with children (HUD Point-in-Time Count 2012).
- Over 75,000 homes were lost to foreclosure in Minnesota between 2008 and 2010 (Minnesota Housing, 2011).
- 11,000 public school students were identified as homeless or highly mobile during the 2011-2012 school year (MN Dept. of Education, 2012).
- One in four Minnesotan renters paid half or more of their monthly income toward rent in 2011
 (American Community Survey, 2011). One in seven Minnesotans paid half or more of their monthly
 income toward housing in 2011 (American Community Survey, 2011). Family stability is compromised
 when households are pay half or more of their income toward housing.
