Q&A's about Online Professional Development Events

Please plan to log into the training a few minutes before the scheduled start time to make sure your system is working properly.

What can I expect with the "real-time" online professional development event?

We are excited to offer "real-time" online professional development events. These events will make a great addition to our face-to-face professional development events. When you participate in a training event utilizing our "real-time" online services, you can expect to get the same high quality training you count on with our face-to-face events. Your facilitator will present the information through the computer and phone line. You will receive your participant workbook via email once you register for the event. Based on the professional event you register for, you may be directed to complete some prep work for the event.

What type of equipment do I need to participate in the "real-time" Professional Development Event?

In order to participate fully in the online professional development event, you will need the following to access the information:

- Phone line (you will call into a toll free number and be on the phone for the whole workshop)
- Computer with internet access (up to three people can use one computer for the training)
- Access to a printer for your workbook materials

What skills are required to participate in "real-time" on-line professional development events?

Basic computer skills are essential in order to maximize learning. Participants who know how to minimize their screen, access the internet, and navigate to different websites will maximize their learning from our "real -time" online professional development events.

How will I receive my materials?

Once you register, you will receive an email from the instructor (check your spam or junk mail) with the materials you will need for the professional development event. If you do not receive your materials 24 hours prior to the training, please call us at 800-243-9685.

Is there any prep work to do prior to the professional development event?

Some of our professional development events do require preparation prior to the event. This may include reading an article, watching short video clips on the internet, or completing a questionnaire. Each of our events will come with an information guide to help prepare you for your professional development event. The information guide will include a checklist with tips to make your event successful.

How do I receive my training certificate?

Once you complete the training and activities, we will mail your certificate to the address you provided on your registration form. Our trainings are very interactive. We expect participation during the "real-time" online events through discussion and completion of activities. Please note, in order to receive your certificate you are required to participate in the discussions and activities. Departments of Social Services and Health and Senior Services require that participants attend the entire training session in order to receive a clock hour certificate. Therefore, instructors and/or staff who are instructing or facilitating clock hour sessions hosted by a Child Care Aware® of Missouri's regional agency may withhold a participant's clock hour certificate.
