To the Family of God at First Church:



During my life I have experienced at least eight major moves. From leaving home to attend college to moving from congregations during my pastoral career, moving to a new community has a certain familiarity. With each move has come the opportunity to reinvent myself. People in a new community have no experience or expectations of me. I can choose to make a fresh start and be different from the way I used to be.

While the move into a New Year is not as dramatic as a move to a new community it also provides an opportunity for a fresh start and for reinventing ourselves. That's the source of the idea of New Year's resolutions. However, most of us are familiar with how easy such resolutions are to make, and how equally easily they seem to fade away a few days into the new year.

Yet, we as people of faith have the added benefit of God's help with our fresh starts. The scripture teaches us that when we are in Christ, we are a new creation. The old passes away. The new is possible. Change is always possible. We do not have to rely on our own strength and determination. We can have the help of the Lord.

I invite you to take a few minutes for self inventory. Are there aspects of your life that are not as you know they should be? Maybe there is an issue with destructive habits. Possibly there are issues which we know are impacting our health. Other issues may involve our tempers, past hurts or damaged relationships. Does it really make sense to carry such damaged parts of our lives into 2012? If we don't make changes now, when will we ever make them? Is it time to reinvent yourself?

Resolutions fade and fail; however, changes rooted in our faith in Christ can endure. The Bible is filled with stories of people like Jacob, David and the Apostle Paul who experienced real and enduring change. If God could help them, surely the same God can help us. Why not consider prayerfully discussing with God the changes you need to make and submitting to God's power to bring new creation in your soul, emotions and actions?

I pray for a Happy New Year. May you discover the power of reinventing yourself without having to call a moving van to move to a different city.

## CLOTHESLINE REPORT FOR 2011



As of December 8th, the Clothesline Project has provided clothing items for 35 children ranging in age from 3 weeks to 14 years. The total items provided are over 150 in number and include pacifiers, shoes, coats, jeans, shirts, boots, pajamas, underwear, socks -- all necessary for growing children.

Many times during the year we receive "Thank You" notes from the Moms, but sometimes a note comes from one of the children like this wonderful note from a 9-year-old girl who has received a winter coat. "Thank you so much. It's really soft and I love it and it keeps me warm. I am so glad I go to Prevail, it is fun and I made new friends and the teachers rock, and I also like to see that other kids are going through this, not just me, and I also like to learn about other types of abuse. I am really glad my Mom found out about Prevail. Once again thank you so so much for the coat!!"

Isn't it wonderful that we can help an organization like Prevail through our Clothesline Project!! Thank you for being such a caring congregation.

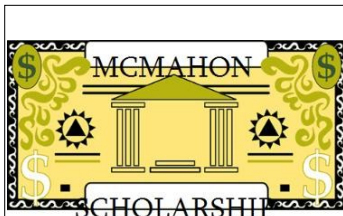

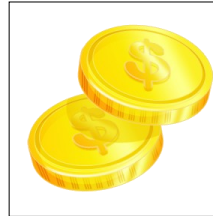


**INCLEMENT WEATHER NOTE—**

Preschool/PDO: Watch for registration information after the first of the year!!!! Our church family and those currently enrolled in our program will have priority registration.





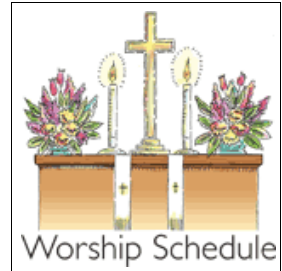
