2013 Missions



Deaf Missions' purpose is to effectively communicate the Gospel of Jesus with deaf **115SIONS** people. The three primary ways we do this have remained the same ever since the 1970s!

I figured when I replaced Duane King as the Director of Deaf Missions in the fall of 2007 that my job was to NOT mess things up! Furthermore, I have decided NOT to take the advice of Tim Allen of Home Improvement, "If it ain't broke, fix it anyway!" Deaf Missions ain't broke and does not need any fixing. As we have for decades, we continue to...

Create and distribute Bible visuals for deaf people. The Bible: ASL Version is an accurate translation from the original Hebrew and Greek texts into American Sign Language that is presented on video. The New Testament has been completed and about 40 percent of the Old Testament is also available. Approximately 22,000 Daily Devotions for the Deaf booklets are mailed three times a year. The devotions in the



booklets are in simple English and also available for viewing in sign language on our website. Big Bible Stories in American Sign Language is a video series for deaf children. So far, we have completed the episodes of Ruth, Gideon, Abraham, Elijah and Jonah. We are currently working on the episode of Josiah.

Train Christians to minister with deaf people. The International Bible Training Center is a three-year program preparing people to become preachers, missionaries and evangelists to impact deaf people throughout the world. This past spring, Deaf Missions trained and encouraged about 250 sign language interpreters who came to our Christian Interpreters Conference. Next spring we will conduct a training conference for preachers of the deaf and Deaf ministry leaders.



Work personally with deaf people. We had a team reach out to deaf orphans in Haiti this past spring. Another team recently returned from a five-week mission outreach to deaf orphans and adults in Kenya, Africa. Deaf elementary, middle and high school students are being taught the Bible at our weekly classes at Iowa School for the Deaf just a couple miles down the road from Deaf Missions in Council Bluffs, Iowa. Duane and

Peggy continue to minister through Operation SERVE, a ministry to Start and Encourage Deaf churches, to Revive the souls of deaf people, to Visit supporters of Deaf Missions and to Enlist new workers.
