FROM THE PASTOR

I noticed the other day that the signs are back up at my gym. Perhaps it is because at the turn of the year people have the tendency towards new resolve. These signs remind us that as members we are entitled to three sessions with a personal trainer and they encourage us to take advantage of this opportunity. During these sessions, we are told, the trainer will talk with us about our fitness goals, will design a workout plan that would get us there, and then will help support us in the practice.

Just seeing the signs gave me a boost. Knowing there were people who were available to me and were willing to help me in my resolve made me feel good. They made me feel that the change I desired may even be possible.

We all know the importance of taking care of our bodies. We are told that even thirty minutes of physical activity five days a week will help prevent many adverse health outcomes and will contribute significantly to health and well being.

We know this but also know how hard it is to actually add some form physical activity to our days. It is a boost to know that someone is there to help us find a way to integrate physical activity into our lives in a way that works. Perhaps we can take the stairs instead of the elevator whenever we can. Perhaps we can walk the kids to school instead of driving. Perhaps we decide that we will lift some hand weights when we are watching the evening news.

Whatever it is, we decide to give it a try and then with support we commit to practicing it regularly. Even if we miss a day or two, we will do our best to pick the activity up again and recommit ourselves to it all over again. We practice and practice until we find it just becomes a part of what we do, who we are -- without really having to think about it much. I have a friend that says that if she does not make it to the gym every day she feels off, like something is missing.

Now the signs at my gym and all the New Year resolve got me thinking about our life together. It got me wondering about putting up signs

around the church reminding you that you are entitled to innumerable sessions with me, your personal spiritual trainer and encouraging you to take advantage of this opportunity. These signs could remind you that during these training sessions, we would talk about your goals of increasing your spiritual health. We would design a workout plan that would help get you there and that I would support you as you commit to and engage in the practice.

I have to say, I really like the idea. For, that kind of coaching and consultation is very much a part of what it is that I am to do among you, and not just me, but Bill, Kathy, and Kathryn as well. We are here to be a resource to you, to help identify what it is you desire in your spiritual life, to help you find a practice that works for you and to support you over time as you engage in that practice.

change happens. Your blood pressure may go down. You may sleep better. You may have more patience with your children. You may not be as tired.

Engage in a regular spiritual activity and it will impact your living as well in equally real and pronounced ways. Your days may be punctuated with inexplicable joy. You may feel more present to that which is going on around you. The world may take on greater relief, colors may be brighter, textures more pronounced. Your heart may swell within you and you may feel a rush of love and compassion for all that is. You may feel a heightened sense of peace and security sensing a power of goodness around you.

It is my greatest hope that in this New Year, each and every one of you will take some time to examine your heart's desire. What is it that you want for your spiritual life? Perhaps you would like a closer relationship with God. Perhaps you would like to develop greater compassion, or the ability to forgive. Perhaps you would like to be able to speak more truthfully, more fully from the heart. Perhaps you would like to cultivate a disposition of gratitude, or humility. Perhaps you need to wrestle with where is God in the face of innocent suffering.

It is my greatest hope that each and every one of you would then take the time to find a practice that works for you and that you would commit to engage that practice on a regular basis. Perhaps that would be to attend worship not as a passive spectator, but as an active participant engaging and contributing your whole self in song, prayer, reflection, word and care. Perhaps it would be to commit to engaging in Sunday morning Bible study, Wednesday morning prayer service, or singing in the choir. Or perhaps it would be to commit to engaging one of the many other offerings at the church: meditation group, book group, spiritual autobiography class, Lunch Bunch, or Waban Health worship service, to name a few.

Or perhaps it is a practice you do on your own or outside of church; weekly walking the labyrinth at Boston College; intentionally engaging God in conversation each morning when you walk the dog, creating a prayer space in your home and sitting each day. The possibilities truly are endless.

It is my greatest hope that my inbox and voicemail at the turn of this year will be filled by you asking for some personal trainer time. That you will feel that the time has come for you to go deeper in your spiritual life in some way and that if you need some help in doing so, that you will reach out to the resources that are available to you – that you will reach out to me, and the rest of your staff.

But do you want to know the really good part? Do you want to know the bonus to which you truly have access? I know it to be true, for I have known it in my own life. By opening the door to a richer spiritual life, you are also opening the door to the in pouring of the presence of God. You will not be alone in your searching, finding and practicing, and your strength to keep going will not be your own. Not only will you have me, and your staff, and this faith community to support you, but you will have God, our Emmanuel at your side.

We only have this one life to live. So what are we waiting for? Let us live it to the fullest!

“Finding the Sacred in Our Own Life Experiences”

Beginning Monday evening, January 7 and running every Monday evening for the next six weeks, Tom Vawter and Stacy Swain will be leading a course in which we will take a look at different moments [or times] in our lives. Through group exercises and opportunities for sharing our unique stories, we will look at and listen for how we experienced ourselves and the world around us during early childhood, elementary years, adolescence, young adulthood and wherever we may now be. And along the way, we will look and listen for God’s presence – or absence – in our life’s journey. It is our hope that by the end of this six week course, we will have found a way to come together and bond in a meaningful way (that may survive and continue on after the course is over), to open doors for each participant to new ideas, new connections to themselves, others and God, and for each participant to have written part of their life story to share within the group, and maybe about which there is the surprise of self-revelation, or coming to a new slant of understanding about an important event or time in their lives.

The dates for the course are January 7, 14, 21, 28, February 4 and 11. We will meet in the Reception Room at church from 7:00 – 9:00 p.m. Understanding that unexpected complications do arise, we are asking that participants make every effort to attend all six sessions since each will build upon the other. ### Bible Study


Bible Study continues this month with a new study of the book of Revelation. We meet on Sunday mornings at 8:00 a.m. in Stacy’s office.

### Union Church-Nicaragua Family Widens in San Juan del Sur


The animal lover and veterinarian-in-training, Fernando Ponce, from San Juan del Sur, is known to many in the Union Church. He has been the host-brother to the Hadleys, Vawters, Laskis, and others, during multiple February service trips. He is very well-known by them — and any visitor to the home — as he takes anybody's dog, cat, etc. into his back room clinic all hours of the day and night; or jumps up from breakfast to catch a bus to a rural farm where a horse is in trouble during delivery.

Recently this amigo of ours had all of his veterinary school equipment stolen from his backpack. This loss put his already slow vet training on hold, as his few resources available for completing a course or two at a time could not be used to replace the expensive items.

But our church-Nica connection just got a bit wider! Nancy Laste is a cardiologist vet at Angel Hospital and was able to gather donated replacement items for Fernando just in time for his clinical internship semester. They were transported by our amiga, Kathy Knight, and delivered to our enormously appreciative Fernando.

Now, Nancy's plan to go with the church to Nicaragua is on the fast track as she and Fernando just have to work together soon. They both have a strong interest in offering free neutering for the animals of Nicaragua.

### Ancianos Event Planned

As we think about the joyous time of Christmas, gathering with friends and family we are reminded of the fun, the laughter, and joy of just being together. While thinking of this, I also think about our connections in San Juan del Sur, and how our elder amigos might have spent the holiday season. Unlike the majority of people in the U.S., they don't get in their car, or take a train or plane to gather with others for the holidays. And in our country and Nicaragua, we know that as we get older it gets harder to travel to see family or to connect with others.

In our trips to Nicaragua, many of us in the congregation have had the opportunity to see how Nicaraguan people honor their older adults. This cultural reverence has been acknowledged and resourced with an initiative by ex-pat Jean Brugger. She began Ancianos (senior citizens) events with a celebration of food, music, and games. She invites all seniors and arranges for folks to be transported. The event is both a party — with good food, dancing and gifts — and an opportunity to connect. This year the UCW Nicaragua Committee has decided to hold our own Ancianos event right here at UCW in March. We want to celebrate our senior generation and any senior in the area. We encourage you all to invite any family, friends, or neighbors and help us make our own Ancianos event that will look a lot like what we learned to do in San Juan del Sur — honor our seniors.

## Local Mission Initiative

### Why Coats?? The Russell School Local Initiative



The Union Church in Waban is a generous Congregation. We are beautifully located in a suburb of Boston, yet we love to define our church as “located” in the Nicaraguan city of San Juan del Sur, and in M'tendere, Zambia, and located at the food pantry, transitional housing in Dorchester, homeless shelters, and at children’s anti-poverty programs.

This generous church lives and breathes giving. We designed a Capital Campaign in 2007 that provided proceeds FIRST to Zambia, Nicaragua and the Boston area, and then to an elevator and critical church music upgrades.

Giving is a given at our church. Generous pledges, overflowing plate offerings, packages piled high under the mitten tree, carloads of books for MTJW and diapers for the Grow Clinic are common here, as are school supplies for Nicaragua, alternative gift fairs for Zambia, tree and wreath sales, and generous commitments of time from Waban Health to week-long service trips in Nicaragua and Zambia. It seems we have opportunities to give nearly every Sunday. And most recently, you opted to donate coats for children of the Russell School in Boston.

As you heard about the opportunity to bring in a warm coat on Sunday for children in Dorchester, did you wonder why there are children without warm coats in our community? We have so much to learn from our work at the Russell School.

The local initiative at the Russell School in Boston will be our newest way to be generous and supportive and a long-term partner – as we always have understood our mission-outreach commitments. It will also teach us.

And, as we understand from Nicaragua and Zambia, we do not prefer to “help” in isolation or without informing ourselves. The Russell School Initiative developed out of our Book Group and our desire to understand prisons, violence and the costs of not paying attention. We informed ourselves a bit, learning that a school partnership can make a difference. Our learning curve is steep as we understand Boston schools, poverty in Boston, and families in need.

The opportunities to be generous at the Union Church are many and optional. The coats have been distributed and the questions of why do children not have warm coats on these biting, windy mornings will continue.

#### Sunday School

Kathy, Stacy and Kathryn Henderson take turns teaching the class in January for a special unit on the Bible. We'll look at why and how we read it, get a general overview of the Old Testament and New Testament, and have a chance to ask Stacy all of our questions.

We'll also be moving to a new room. Teachers have found that the proximity of the Stage to the Vestry, as well as the lounge-like atmosphere of the couches, present too many distractions. The class will now claim the old 'Choir Room' which is up the stairs above the Crocker Chapel.

#### Confirmation

As part of a general envisioning of rites of passage and faith formation goals for all the children of UCW, the CE Committee has begun making plans for the next Confirmation class. The next class will start in Fall 2014 for kids in 8th, 9th, and 10th grades, which includes all the kids currently in the Faith Seekers class. We are envisioning an experiential program. Rather than being structured around major theological concepts (such as God, Jesus, the Bible), kids will work with mentors to define a social justice/mission project. Meetings of the whole Confirmation class will be used to provide a faith context and address theological issues which surround the different projects.

To make this approach workable, we envision using this year and next year for pre-Confirmation preparation. This year we have begun using the 're:form' curriculum with the kids. The program challenges youth to wrestle with historic Christian faith and theology, with an emphasis on exploration rather than on indoctrination.


