INTRODUCTION

Doncaster's four-day Ladbrokes St Leger Festival is one of the jewels of the English racing season and has been staged in the town since 1776, when Allabaculia won the first running of the world's oldest Classic race.

This year's glittering four-day extravaganza kicks off on Wednesday, September 12, Welcome To Yorkshire Day. Racegoers are in for a treat on the opening day, when some of the most popular and successful jockeys from the past will don the silks one more time in the third running of the Clipper Logistics Leger Legends Classified Stakes over the straight mile. The race is in aid of two Yorkshire-based charity projects - the Jack Berry House in Malton and the Northern Racing College. A star-studded line-up includes St Leger-winning riders George Duffield, John Reid and Kevin Darley.

For the second year running American legend Julie Krone, the world's most successful female jockey who scored a memorable victory in 2011, will take part plus Gary Bardwell, Tony Clark, Nicky Connorton, George Duffield, Dale Gibson, Luke Harvey, Gay Kelleway, Mick Kinane, Allan Mackay, Tom O'Ryan, Jamie Osborne, Ollie Pears and Willie Ryan. The Princess Royal and Lester Piggott will also be in attendance.

DFS Ladies Day on Thursday, September 13, is one of South Yorkshire's biggest social occasions and there will be plenty of finely-attired fillies hoping to be crowned the Best Dressed Lady at the 2012 Ladbrokes St Leger Festival, with the star prize being the use of a DFS car for a year plus a stay at the Crown Hotel Bawtry and a host of other goodies. The winner will then join the finalists from each of the Yorkshire racecourses to compete for the title of Yorkshire Racing's Best Dressed Lady. DFS Ladies Day features the Group Two DFS Park Hill Stakes and the Weatherbys Insurance £300,000 2-Y-O Stakes.

Stobart Doncaster Cup Day on Friday, September 14, features the longest race and certainly one of the most popular spectacles staged on Town Moor, the Group Two Stobart Doncaster Cup. The day also plays host to a pair of high-class two-year-old events, the five-furlong Group Two Polypipe Flying Childers Stakes for speedy youngsters and the Group Two Barrett Steel May Hill Stakes for fillies over a mile.

The 236th Ladbrokes St Leger, worth a record £550,000 in 2012, takes centre stage on Saturday, September 15, when the all eyes will be on Camelot as he bids to become the 16th winner of the Triple Crown and the first since Nijinsky in 1970. His trainer Aidan O'Brien is aiming to become the first handler to send out the winners of all five British Classics in the same year. A superb support card on Ladbrokes St Leger Day also includes the Group Two OLBG Park Stakes over seven furlongs, the Group Two One Call Insurance Champagne Stakes over the same distance for some of the year's top two-year-olds, and the historic Ladbrokes Portland Handicap over an extended five furlongs.

Both the Ladbrokes St Leger and Stobart Doncaster Cup form part of the QIPCO British Champions Series.

THE TRIPLE CROWN

The Triple Crown is the accolade achieved by a horse that wins the English Classics open to colts – the QIPCO 2,000 Guineas over a mile at Newmarket at the beginning of May, the Investec Derby over 12 furlongs at Epsom Downs in early June and the Ladbrokes St Leger at Doncaster.

Camelot, if successful in the Ladbrokes St Leger in 2012, would become the first Triple Crown winner for 42 years. Since Nijinsky won the Triple Crown in 1970, no horse has attempted to repeat the feat.

Only Nashwan (1989) and Sea The Stars (2009) won both the 2,000 Guineas and the Derby in the intervening period, but did not contest the St Leger. Reference Point (1987) won the Derby and St Leger but did not run in the 2,000 Guineas.

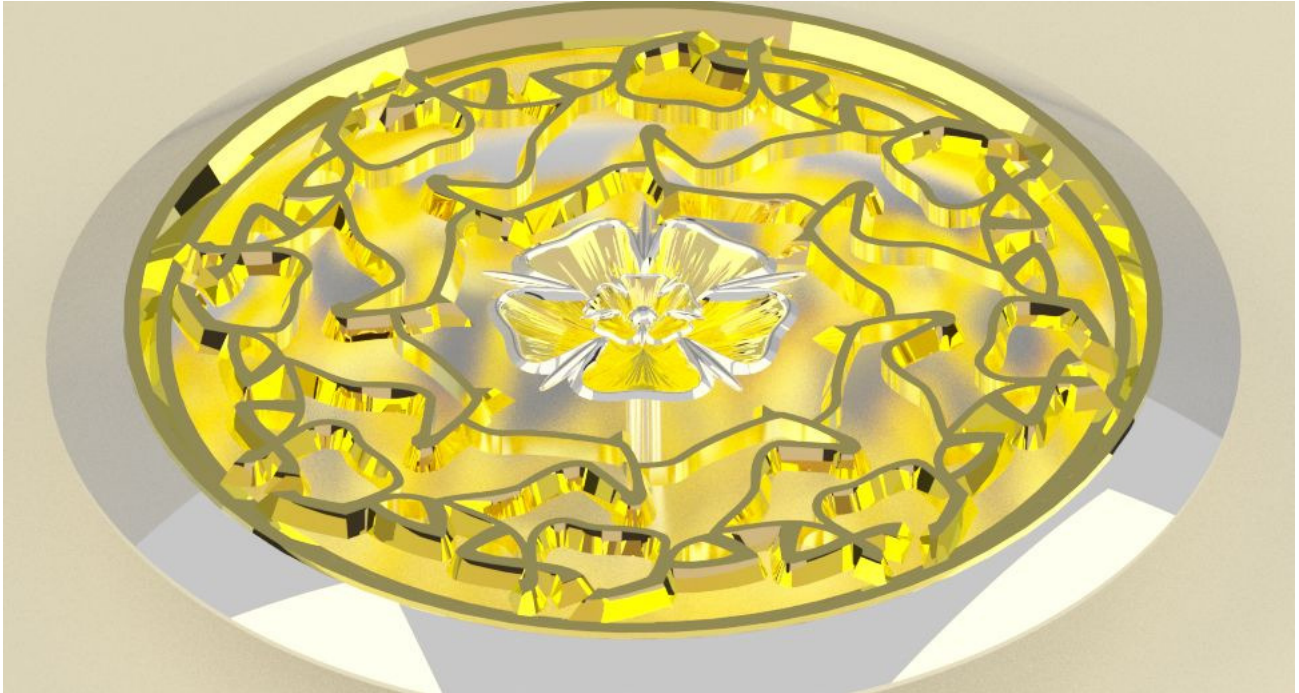

The founding inspiration for the 2012 winner's Rose Bowl centrepiece has its roots in the beginnings of 18th century motion pictures, in particular the work of Eadweard Muybridge, who was a pioneer in capturing the beauty and movement of a horse in full gallop through stop action photographs using multiple cameras.

This striking movement has been translated into the decorative grill of the Rose Bowl, which is constructed from several cast elements that echo the rhythm of the horse in motion around the perimeter of the bowl.

The surrounding horses are centralised by the Yorkshire Rose, which is constructed from two cast silver elements with a gold plate finish.

The Ladbrokes St Leger – The World's Oldest Classic

No Classic anywhere across the globe can boast a history to rival that of the St Leger which has been staged since 1776 and is sponsored for an eighth year by Ladbrokes.

The race is named after a local sportsman, Anthony St Leger, who lived at Park Hill near Doncaster and had the idea of a race for three-year-olds, colts carrying 8st and fillies 7st 12lb, over two miles.

A field of six runners lined up for the inaugural St Leger on September 24, 1776, with an unnamed filly by Sampson (later called Allabaculia) owned by the Prime Minister, the Marquess of Rockingham, beating Colonel St Leger's filly by Trusty.

The race did not have a title in 1778, when Rockingham proposed that it should carry St Leger's name, and it was in the same year that the event moved to the present site on Doncaster's Town Moor, with the first two runnings having been staged at nearby Cantley Common.

Trainer/jockey John Mangle, known as 'Crying Jackie' for his habit of bursting into tears when beaten, won five of the 18th century renewals, while Champion, owned by Yorkshireman Christopher Wilson, in 1800 became the first Derby winner to go on to St Leger glory, helping enhance the race's stature. The Classic's distance was shortened to one mile, six furlongs and 193 yards in 1813.

West Australian, trained in Malton by John Scott, became the first winner of the Triple Crown, encompassing the 2,000 Guineas, Derby and St Leger, in 1853, a feat that only 14 other horses have achieved since, most recently Nijinsky in 1970. Camelot attempts to become the 16th Triple Crown winner this year.

Scott sent out a record 16 St Leger winners, starting with The Colonel in 1828 and ending with The Marquis in 1862.

The brilliant Ormonde, winner of the three Classics in 1886, was another to reach the landmark and, for many, the Duke of Westminster's home bred, one of Fred Archer's six St Leger winners, figures among the greatest ever thoroughbreds.

The opening years of the 20th century were a tremendous era in turf history with the remarkable filly Sceptre, who had won the 1,000 Guineas, 2,000 Guineas, Oaks and finished fourth in the Derby, going on to win the 1902 St Leger.

Two years later, another brilliant filly was cheered into the Doncaster winner's enclosure. Pretty Polly had won the 1,000 Guineas, Oaks, Coronation Stakes and Nassau Stakes as well as the Park Hill Stakes at Doncaster, before landing the final Classic.

Hyperion was another great winner in 1933 and came to Doncaster unbeaten in three runs that season, having triumphed in the Chester Vase, Derby and Prince Of Wales's Stakes at Royal Ascot. He made all to beat a very strong field, which included the winners of the French and Irish Derbys, in good style. The third Aga Khan's Bahram was probably the best of the owner's six St Leger winners, trained by Frank Butters to win all nine races he contested, including the 1935 Triple Crown.

The First World War saw the St Leger run at Newmarket from 1915-1918, while during the Second World War it took place at Thirsk in 1940, Manchester in 1941, Newmarket from 1942-1944 and at York in 1945.

The only year the St Leger was not staged was 1939, while the 1989 renewal was held at Ayr when the ground was considered unfit on Town Moor and the 2006 Classic was run at York due to the redevelopment of Doncaster.

Post-war racegoers heading to Doncaster in 1946 witnessed another great winner when the grey Airborne followed up on his Derby success, something achieved by Tulyar (1952) and Never Say Die (1954), who set the record winning margin of 12 lengths, and St Paddy (1960).

The World's Oldest Classic continued

Alcide was the wide margin victor in 1958, winning by eight lengths, and the great Irish horse Ragusa came home six lengths clear of his rivals five years later.

Lester Piggott, St Paddy's rider, was to take the Classic eight times but none of his winners were better than the Vincent O'Brien-trained Nijinsky, the most recent Triple Crown winner, who drew a huge crowd to Doncaster when winning in 1970.

There was no more appropriate or popular winner than the Queen's filly Dunfermline in 1977, who followed up on her Oaks success in the year of her owner's Silver Jubilee and defeated subsequent dual Arc de Triomphe victor Alleged in the process.

Touching Wood signalled the arrival of the Maktoum family as a major force in world racing when scoring in the late Sheikh Maktoum's colours in 1982, while that emergence was emphasised when Sheikh Mohammed's Oh So Sharp completed the fillies' Triple Crown (1,000 Guineas, Oaks and St Leger) in 1985.

Reference Point in 1987 was the most recent Derby winner to follow up in the St Leger, while the last French-trained winner was Toulon from the Andre Fabre stable in 1991. The star filly User Friendly, the 1992 Oaks heroine, provided her Yorkshire-born jockey George Duffield with a St Leger success.

Classic Cliche gave Godolphin, the Maktoum family's racing operation, a first St Leger win in 1995, when scoring under Frankie Dettori, while the royal blue colours have also been carried to victory aboard Nedawi in 1998, Mutafaweq the following year, Rule Of Law in 2004 and Mastery in 2009.

Ireland's champion trainer Aidan O'Brien enjoyed his first St Leger victory when sending out Milan to success in 2001. O'Brien won the great race in 2003 for a second time when Brian Boru scored under Jamie Spencer. The Ballydoyle handler made it three wins in 2005, when Scorpion powered home by a length under Frankie Dettori.

The 2002 St Leger produced a hugely popular result when Bollin Eric, trained near Malton by Tim Easterby, became the first Yorkshire-trained winner of Yorkshire's Classic since Peleid in 1973.

The 2006 renewal at York was won by Sixties Icon, who saw off The Last Drop and Red Rocks (successful later that season in the Breeders' Cup Turf) to provide trainer Jeremy Noseda with his first English Classic victory.

Jimmy Fortune enjoyed his first Classic triumph when partnering the John Gosden-trained Lucarno to a length victory over the Ballydoyle duo of Mahler and Honolulu in 2007. For the handler, it was a second win in the Ladbrokes St Leger, having been successful with Shantou in 1993.

Despite saddling 25 runners in the contest, no less than five of whom finished runner-up, the Ladbrokes St Leger was the only Classic to have eluded the then nine-time champion trainer Sir Michael Stoute. However, that statistic finally changed in 2008 when Conduit prevailed. Having been deserted by stable jockey Ryan Moore, Conduit gave Frankie Dettori a fifth success in the race, making him the most successful current jockey. The Ballymacoll Stud-owned colt went on to prove himself one of the best recent winners of the Ladbrokes St Leger with two victories in the Breeders' Cup Turf in the USA and the 2009 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Stakes at Ascot.

Having picked up the lucrative ride on Conduit a year earlier, in 2009 it was Frankie Dettori who made the wrong decision as he partnered the 9/4 favourite Kite Wood for his main employer Godolphin. However, Kite Wood was unable to hold back the challenge of stablemate Mastery, who prevailed by three-quarters of a length under Ted Durcan, and gave trainer Saeed bin Suroor his fifth training triumph.

Arctic Cosmos provided Gosden with a third Ladbrokes St Leger success in 2010, while it was a first British Classic victory for his jockey William Buick. For good measure, Arctic Cosmos was part-owned by Gosden's wife and current ROA president Rachel Hood.

It was a fourth Ladbrokes St Leger victory for Gosden and second for Buick in 2011 when Masked Marvel stayed on strongly to score by three lengths from Brown Panther, who is owned by England footballer Michael Owen.

No other Classic can boast such a long and illustrious history and who knows what the 236th running will produce on Saturday, September 15, 2012, over a mile, six furlongs and 132 yards.

LADBROKES ST LEGER FACTS & FIGURES

Largest Field: 30 runners went to post in 1825. The current safety limit is 20.

Smallest Field: In 1917, when the race was run at Newmarket, Gay Crusader only had to see off three rivals. The smallest fields at Doncaster were in 1783 and 1785, when only four runners went to post.

Biggest Shocks: Ottrington (1812) and Theodore (1822) both won at 100/1. In more recent times, Moonax was 40/1 when scoring in 1994.

Shortest-Priced Winner: Galtee More (1897) was sent off at 1/10.

Most Successful Jockey: Bill Scott with nine wins – Jack Spigot (1821), Memnon (1825), The Colonel (1828), Rowton (1829), Don John (1838), Charles The Twelfth (1839), Launcelot (1840), Satirist (1841) and Sir Tatton Sykes (1846). Lester Piggott rode eight St Leger winners and is the second most successful jockey in the final Classic, followed by Fred Archer (six wins).

Most Successful Current Jockey: Frankie Dettori with five wins (Classic Cliche 1995, Shantou 1996, Scorpion 2005, Sixties Icon 2006 and Conduit 2008).

Jockey Landmark: William Buick, who has been successful in the last two Ladbrokes St Legers, will become the first jockey since Lester Piggott in 1972 to partner three successive winners if he rides the victor this year.

Most Successful Trainer: John Scott (brother of Bill Scott) with 16 wins. Scott's winners were Matilda (1827), The Colonel (1828), Rowton (1829), Margrave (1832), Touchstone (1834), Don John (1838), Charles The Twelfth (1839), Launcelot (1840), Satirist (1841), The Baron (1845), Newminster (1851), West Australian (1853), Warlock (1856), Imperieuse (1857), Gamester (1859) and The Marquis (1862). Other St Leger specialists have been Mat Dawson, John Porter, Cecil Boyd-Rochfort and Dick Hern, who all trained six winners.

Most Successful Current Trainer: Godolphin's Saeed bin Suroor with five victories - Mastery (2009), Rule Of Law (2004), Mutafaweq (1999), Nedawi (1998) and Classic Cliche (1995).

Trainer Landmark: Aidan O'Brien, who has sent out three winners of the Ladbrokes St Leger – Milan (2001), Brian Boru (2003) and Scorpion (2005) – will become the first trainer to win all five British Classics in the same year if successful in 2012.

Most Successful Owners: The 17th Earl of Derby and HH Aga Khan III both enjoyed six victories. The Earl of Derby's winners were Swynford (1910), Keysoe (1919), Tranquil (1923), Fairway (1928), Hyperion (1933) and Herringbone (1943). HH Aga Khan's wins came with Salmon Trout (1924), Firdaussi (1932), Barham (1935), Turkham (1940), Tehran (1944) and Tulyar (1952). The present Aga Khan has yet to own a St Leger winner.

Most Successful Current Owner: Godolphin with five victories - Mastery (2009), Rule Of Law (2004), Mutafaweq (1999), Nedawi (1998) and Classic Cliche (1995).

Winning Brothers: The St Leger winners Ribocco (1967) and Ribero (1968) were full-brothers. Both were owned by Charles Engelhard, trained by Fulke Johnson Houghton and ridden by Lester Piggott.

Winning Favourites: In the 66 renewals since the end of World War II, 25 favourites have won the Ladbrokes St Leger. The most recent of those was Sixties Icon at 11/8 in 2006. Nine of the 25 winning favourites were returned at odds-on, the shortest-priced winner being the 1970 Triple Crown hero Nijinsky at 2/7.

Irish-Trained Winners: Since 1945, seven horses trained in Ireland have won the Ladbrokes St Leger. The first of those was Ballymoss in 1957 for trainer Vincent O'Brien, who also scored with Nijinsky (1970) and Boucher (1972). Aidan O'Brien saddled Milan (2001), Brian Boru (2003) and Scorpion (2005) to victory, while Paddy Prendergast provided the other Irish success with Ragusa (1963).

French-trained winners: Six French-trained horses have landed the Ladbrokes St Leger in the same period, the first being Scratch II in 1950 for trainer Charles Semblat, who followed up a year later with Talma II. The Andre Fabre-trained Toulon in 1991 was the most recent French success.

FILLIES IN THE LADBROKES ST LEGER

Since its first running in 1776, a total of 41 fillies have landed the final Classic, although only six since the Second World War.

The first St Leger went to a filly, Allabaculia, and some great female performers have since graced the Doncaster winner's enclosure including Sceptre in 1902 and Pretty Polly two years later.

The six post-War winners were Meld (1955), bookmaker William Hill's Cantelo (1959), the Queen's Dunfermline (1977), Sun Princess (1983), the last fillies' Triple Crown winner Oh So Sharp (1985) and User Friendly (1992). Of the sextet, all bar Cantelo (who was second at Epsom) had previously won the Oaks.

Diminuendo, also an Oaks winner, was only thwarted by a length as Minster Son outstayed the filly close home in 1988, while Ramruma, the Epsom heroine in 1999, had to settle for second behind Mutafaweq three months later at Doncaster. In 2008, Look Here took third behind Conduit after her Epsom success while Snow Fairy, the 2010 Oaks heroine, appeared not to stay when fourth to Arctic Cosmos.

Other placed fillies include Untold, who was third to Moon Madness in 1986, Roseate Tern who finished second to Michelozzo at Ayr in 1989, Hellenic who was runner-up to Snurge in 1990, the 1999 second High And Low, Quiff, who found only Rule Of Law too strong in 2004, and most recently Unsung Heroine who finished second behind Conduit in 2008.

The Group One Darley Yorkshire Oaks is a popular stepping stone for fillies that tackle the final Classic, with every placed filly listed below (bar Unsung Heroine and Look Here in 2008) as well as winners Dunfermline (1977), Sun Princess (1983) and User Friendly (1992) having contested the York race before coming onto Doncaster.

York and Doncaster share similar characteristics as both are left-handed tracks with long home straights.

Camelot

Camelot was born and raised at Highclere Stud having been bred by Sheikh Abdulla bin Isa Al-Khalifa, who has been a client of the Berkshire farm for around 25 years. Sheikh Abdulla bred and raced Camelot's dam Tarfah, who was trained by Gerard Butler to win the Group Three Dahlia Stakes at Newmarket in 2005. He was raised in a paddock with Dante Stakes winner Bonfire and sold at the 2009 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale, where he was bought for 525,000 guineas by Coolmore with Paul Cole, acting for Dr Jim Hay, the underbidder. He was at the forefront of the 2012 Classics' betting even before he made his debut at Leopardstown on July 14 last year, when justifying 1/3 favouritism to win a mile maiden by two lengths. His second start came when impressively winning the Group One Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster by two and a quarter lengths on October 22. He made a winning reappearance in the first Classic of 2012, the QIPCO 2,000 Guineas at Newmarket on May 5 when the 15/8 favourite. At Newmarket, he was held up off the pace before making stealthy headway entering the final quarter mile. He hit the front inside the final furlong and stayed on well to repel the challenge of French Fifteen by a neck. That success provided Montjeu with his first Classic winner over a mile and marked Camelot down as a colt of the highest quality. He continued to justify his trainer's regard for him with a breathtaking five-length victory in the Investec Derby over 12 furlongs at Epsom on June 2, sweeping from the rear of the field to score by five lengths. He became the second horse since Nashwan in 1989 to complete the 2,000 Guineas/Derby double after Sea The Stars in 2009. He extended his unbeaten record to five under Joseph O'Brien with a gutsy two-length success in the Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby on soft/heavy ground at the Curragh on June 30. He bids to become the first horse since Nijinsky in 1970 to land the colts' Triple Crown.

Derrick Smith, Sue Magnier, Michael Tabor

Sue Magnier's dark blue silks are a common sight in Europe's top races and have been carried by several of the sport's true champions. Few in racing can boast better connections than Magnier, whose father, the late Vincent O'Brien, was arguably the greatest trainer of the 20th century and saddled six Epsom Derby winners. Her brother David O'Brien also saddled a Derby winner, while another brother, Charles O'Brien, is a successful trainer. Her sister Jane is married to former Goffs managing director and current Tattersalls Ireland director and auctioneer Philip Myerscough. She is married to John Magnier, one of the most powerful men in the bloodstock world as owner of the global Coolmore breeding empire. In the 1970s, John Magnier (born February 10, 1948), the son of a County Cork dairy farmer and stud owner, teamed up with Robert Sangster and Vincent O'Brien to buy potential stallions as yearlings. They enjoyed great success, counting Alleged, Be My Guest, El Gran Senor, Golden Fleece, Sadler's Wells and Storm Bird amongst those they bought. Magnier, a former Irish senator who owns the magnificent Ballydoyle training establishment, eventually bought out his partners at Coolmore, which has huge offshoots in Australia and the USA. His fortune was estimated at £507 million in the 2012 Sunday Times Rich List. His myriad of other business interests include investment in the Barchester chain of nursing homes, a stake in British pub group Mitchells & Butlers, a property portfolio, the Sandy Lane Hotel in Barbados and Global Radio, founded by Michael Tabor's son Ashley. He and top jump owner J P McManus held a 28.7% stake in Manchester United, which they sold to US tycoon Malcolm Glazer in 2005. Sue Magnier, along with Michael Tabor and Manchester United manager Sir Alex Ferguson, in whose colours he ran, owned the brilliant champion miler Rock Of Gibraltar, who set a new European record of seven consecutive Group One victories in 2001/02. Magnier's colours were carried to an unprecedented four successive triumphs in the Ascot Gold Cup aboard the great Yeats between 2006 and 2009. Other champions to sport the dark blue include Galileo, King Of Kings, Hawk Wing, Giant's Causeway, Imagine, George Washington, Duke Of Marmalade, Dylan Thomas, Henrythenavigator and Rip Van Winkle. Last season, Magnier's dark blue silks were carried to victory in the Investec Derby with Pour Moi, the Irish 2,000 Guineas with Roderic O'Connor and the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf with Wrote. The current campaign has been brilliant so far with Coolmore partnerships winning all four British Classics so far - the QIPCO 2,000 Guineas (Camelot), QIPCO 1000 Guineas (Homecoming Queen), Investec Oaks (Was), Investec Derby (Camelot) - as well as the Irish 2,000 Guineas (Power) and Irish Derby (Camelot). **Michael Tabor's** silks are blue with orange disc, blue and orange striped sleeves and cap. They first gained prominence aboard the Neville Callaghan-trained hurdler Royal Derbi, winner of the 1993 Irish Champion Hurdle and have since been carried to Group One success in Flat races around the globe. London-born and Monaco-based Tabor founded the Arthur Prince bookmaking firm and sold it for £28 million in 1995. That year, Thunder Gulch won the Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes in his colours and at around that time he became a partner in many of the Coolmore horses. He spends a lot of his time in Barbados and was valued at £550 million in the 2012 Sunday Times Rich List. The best horses to carry his colours also include Montjeu, High Chaparral, Hurricane Run, Entrepreneur, Desert King, Johannesburg, Stravinsky, Starspangledbanner, Lillie Langtry, Peeping Fawn, Misty For Me and 2007 Belmont Stakes heroine Rags To Riches. **Derrick Smith** is a former Ladbrokes trading director based in Barbados. He is also an investor in Barchester Healthcare and has made huge profits from currency trading. In 2012, the Sunday Times Rich List estimated his wealth at £550 million. In 2004, he became a Coolmore investor and his purple silks with white seams, purple and white striped sleeves and purple cap have become a common sight atop such horses as last year's Irish Derby winner Treasure Beach, 2011 Breeders' Cup Turf and dual Coronation Cup victor St Nicholas Abbey, Ascot Gold Cup victor Fame And Glory, Simply Perfect, Astronomer Royal, Mastercraftsman and the 2010 Irish Derby and Irish Champion Stakes winner Cape Blanco as well Australian import So You Think, a five-time Group One winner Down Under who won the Tattersalls Gold Cup (2011 and 2012), Coral-Eclipse (2011), Irish Champion Stakes (2011) and Prince of Wales's Stakes (2012). Following an Investec Oaks win on June 1 with Was, the unbeaten Camelot, winner of the QIPCO 2,000 Guineas, carried Smith's colours and won the Investec Derby as 8/13 favourite and followed up in the Irish equivalent at the Curragh on June 30. He will try to become the first Triple Crown winner since Nijinsky in 1970 and 16th in all.

Aidan O'Brien

Born in County Wexford on October 16, 1969, one of six children of Stella and Denis O'Brien, Aidan Patrick O'Brien, who started out as an amateur rider and took the Irish amateur riders' title over jumps in 1993/94, has been a training phenomenon. After a three-year spell with Jim Bolger, he became assistant to his now wife, Annemarie, and her father Joe Crowley, before taking over the reins when granted a licence to train himself in 1993. With Joe Crowley, the couple have around 20 mares at Carriganog Stud in County Kilkenny and have enjoyed considerable success as breeders via the likes of Rock Of Gibraltar, Dewhurst Stakes winner Beethoven, Group Two scorer King Torus and Jersey Stakes heroine Ishvana. Wandering Thoughts was his first winner as a trainer, taking a seven-furlong handicap at Tralee on June 7, 1993. His impact on the Flat was made with backing of the highest calibre in the shape of John Magnier and Coolmore, who offered O'Brien the use of Ballydoyle Stables, where the trainer's legendary namesake, Vincent O'Brien (no relation), had enjoyed so much success. His first Group One winner came at the Curragh in 1996 when Desert King won the National Stakes. In 1997, in only his third season at the helm of the Tipperary yard, he confirmed his intentions on the Flat when winning the Irish 1,000 Guineas, Irish 2,000 Guineas and Irish Derby. The following year, his first British Classic runner, King Of Kings, won the 2,000 Guineas and the second, Shahtoush, finished runner-up in the following day's 1,000 Guineas and went on to land the Oaks a month later. The successes have since flowed thanks to the likes of Giant's Causeway (five successive Group Ones in 2,000), Stravinsky, Fasliyev and an embarrassment of riches in 2001 that yielded 23 Group One successes headed by the Investec Derby at Epsom and the Irish Derby, as well as the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Stakes, with Galileo and the Ladbrokes St Leger with Milan. Other Classic glory came via Imagine (Irish 1,000 Guineas and Investec Oaks), Black Minnaloushe (Irish 2,000 Guineas) and Rose Gypsy (French 1,000 Guineas) while Mozart became champion sprinter and O'Brien totally dominated the two-year-old division as Johannesburg provided him with a first Breeders' Cup success in the 2001 Juvenile at Belmont Park. He was champion trainer in both Britain and Ireland in 2001, 2002, 2007 and 2008. In 2002 he enjoyed success with the remarkable Rock Of Gibraltar (the first horse to win seven European Group Ones in a row including the 2,000 Guineas) and also the dual Derby and Breeders' Cup winner High Chaparral. His prowess on the Flat is matched by his achievements with jumpers, though he no longer trains under National Hunt Rules. He will forever be associated with Istabraq, winner of three Champion Hurdles. Rock Of Gibraltar and Hawk Wing gave O'Brien a 1-2 in the 2002 2,000 Guineas, while High Chaparral and Hawk Wing provided him with the first and second in the 2002 Investec Derby. The following season he sent out Yesterday to win the Irish 1,000 Guineas and Brian Boru triumphed at Doncaster in the Ladbrokes St Leger. O'Brien enjoyed further success with Hawk Wing in the Lockinge Stakes and High Chaparral in the Irish Champion Stakes and Breeders' Cup Turf in 2003. He had an incredible Classic double at Newmarket in the spring of 2005 when he won both the 2,000 Guineas (Footstepsinthesand) and the 1,000 Guineas (Virginia Waters), and added a third British Classic with Scorpion's success in the Ladbrokes St Leger at Doncaster. Oratorio captured the Coral-Eclipse and Irish Champion Stakes, and O'Brien also unleashed a raft of high-class two-year-olds, ending the season with the top-rated European juvenile colt (George Washington) and filly (Rumplestiltskin). George Washington captured the 2,000 Guineas and Queen Elizabeth II Stakes in 2006, while Alexandrova took the Investec Oaks as well as the Irish and Yorkshire equivalents, and Dylan Thomas won the Irish Derby and Irish Champion Stakes. O'Brien enjoyed further Classic success in 2007 with Soldier Of Fortune in the Irish Derby, Peeping Fawn in the Irish Oaks and Astronomer Royal in the French 2,000 Guineas, while Dylan Thomas collected the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Stakes and the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. In 2008, O'Brien carried all before him winning six Classics with Henrythenavigator (English & Irish 2,000 Guineas), Halfway To Heaven (Irish 1,000 Guineas), Frozen Fire (Irish Derby) Moonstone (Irish Oaks) and Septimus (Irish St Leger) - as well as five Group Ones with Duke Of Marmalade, whose triumphs included the Prince of Wales's Stakes, King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Stakes and Juddmonte International. O'Brien won the Irish 2,000 Guineas in 2009 with Mastercraftsman, his ninth consecutive Irish Classic success. Other landmarks which fell to O'Brien in 2009 included a record seventh victory in the Irish Derby with Fame And Glory and Yeats winning an unprecedented fourth Ascot Gold Cup. In 2010 Fame And Glory and crack sprinter Starspangledbanner each clinched two Group One wins, while Lillie Langtry, Rip Van Winkle and Zoffany triumphed in the top grade and Cape Blanco gave him an eighth Irish Derby success as well as winning the Irish Champion Stakes. The 2011 season started on a great note with Roderic O'Connor, ridden by O'Brien's then 17-year-old son Joseph, winning the Irish 2,000 Guineas and Misty For Me landing the fillies' equivalent a day later. Treasure Beach brought another Irish Derby while he also oversaw champion juvenile Camelot, winner of the Group One Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster, and leading two-year-old filly Maybe, who captured the Group One Moyglare Stud Stakes. Other 2011 highlights came when Australian superstar So You Think won the Tattersalls Gold Cup, Coral-Eclipse at Sandown and the Irish Champion Stakes. Fame And Glory won the Gold Cup at Ascot, while Cape Blanco took three Grade Ones in America, where Wrote and St Nicholas Abbey completed a double at the Breeders' Cup in November, winning the Juvenile Turf and Turf respectively. He won his sixth QIPCO 2,000 Guineas with Camelot, ridden by Joseph, on May 5 at Newmarket and completed a memorable double when Homecoming Queen took the QIPCO 1,000 Guineas 24 hours later. Power, again ridden by Joseph, won the Irish 2,000 Guineas on May 26. O'Brien won the 2012 Investec Oaks on June 1 with Was and he made it a clean sweep so far of the British Classics with success in the Investec Derby on June 2 with Camelot. He and his son Joseph became the first trainer/jockey father/son combination to win the Derby in its long history. Camelot also won the Irish Derby (a ninth winner of the Classic for O'Brien) on June 30 and is set to attempt to become the first Triple Crown winner since Nijinsky in 1970 in this year's Ladbrokes St Leger. O'Brien has trained 37 winners at Royal Ascot, including the 2012 Prince of Wales's Stakes with So You Think. The Group Ones have continued to flow in 2012 with Imperial Monarch capturing the Grand Prix de Paris, Excelebration triumphing in the Prix Jacques Le Marois and Pedro The Great giving the handler his 12th victory in the Keeneland Phoenix Stakes. He will become the first trainer to win all five British Classics in the same year if sending out the 2012 Ladbrokes St Leger victor.

Joseph O'Brien

Joseph O'Brien is the eldest of Aidan and Annemarie O'Brien's four children and was born on May 23, 1993. Educated at Rockwell College near Cashel, he was an accomplished Pony Club rider, winning a bronze medal at the European Pony Championships in 2009. He began riding on the Flat as a 16-year-old on May 24, 2009, and enjoyed his first winner four days later on Johann Zoffany (now named Muir), trained by his father, at Leopardstown on May 28. His career stepped up a gear in 2010 as he rode 39 winners and was joint champion apprentice in a three-way tie with Ben Curtis and Gary Carroll. He enjoyed a first Pattern race success on Beethoven, bred by his parents, in the Group Three Desmond Stakes in August, 2010. Last year he had a first Classic success on Roderic O'Connor in the Irish 2,000 Guineas and finished fourth in the Investec Derby and third in the Irish Derby on Memphis Tennessee. He added a further Group One victory to his CV when Maybe landed the Moyglare Stud Stakes at the Curragh on August 28 and was aboard Camelot when winning the Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster in October. He also captured the Breeders' Cup Turf at Churchill Downs in November on St Nicholas Abbey. His sister Sarah made her riding debut when fifth on Nantucket Bay in the Ladies' Derby at the Curragh in July last year. He won the QIPCO 2,000 Guineas on May 5 aboard Camelot on his first ride in the Newmarket Classic and won the Irish equivalent for the second year in succession on May 26 aboard Power. He won the Investec Derby at his second attempt on June 2 on 8/13 favourite Camelot and is part of the first trainer/jockey father/son successful combination in the Derby ever. O'Brien has since landed the Irish Derby aboard Camelot, the Grand Prix de Paris on Imperial Monarch and also enjoyed his first victory at Royal Ascot on So You Think in the Prince Of Wales's Stakes.

Main Sequence

The home-bred Main Sequence is from the family of 2007 Oaks heroine Light Shift and caused a 50/1 shock on his debut when landing a mile maiden at Yarmouth on September 15. Despite running very green, he showed a willing attitude and quickened up impressively in the final furlong to score by an ultimately comfortable length and a quarter. He showed that shock success was certainly no fluke at Newmarket on October 19, when he was the comfortable three and a quarter length winner of a nine-furlong nursery. After being added to the Investec Derby at the £8,000 second entry stage in April, he won a 10-furlong Newmarket handicap on April 19 comfortably. He was stepped up in class for the Group Three Betfred Derby Trial over 12 furlongs on Polytrack at Lingfield on May 12 and passed the test with flying colours when beating Shantaram by three-quarters of a length. He continued to progress when a staying-on second to Camelot in the Investec Derby on June 2 before enduring a luckless passage under regular rider Ted Durcan in the Group One Grand Prix de Paris on July 12, finishing one and a quarter lengths behind Imperial Monarch in fourth. On his latest start, he was beaten a head into second by Thought Worthy in the Group Two Great Voltigeur Stakes at York on August 22.

Niarchos Family

The famous racing colours of Greek shipping magnate Stavros Niarchos, who died aged 87 on April 15, 1996, are continued by his children with daughter Maria Niarchos-Gouaze, a member of Breeders' Cup Ltd, effectively running the racing operation. Stavros Niarchos, who was married five times, developed one of the world's largest fleets of tankers and bulk carriers and became a famous art collector. He first became involved in racing in the 1950s but lost interest before returning with a vengeance in the 1970s, campaigning a host of top-class performers, including Nureyev, 1000 Guineas winner Miesque, Machiavellian, Hector Protector, Hernando and Kingmambo. Although he never won the Epsom Derby, Niarchos owned the 1985 runner-up Law Society. The Niarchos family, who bred the 2003 Derby hero Kris Kin, have continued the tradition of excellence, through the likes of Breeders' Cup winners Spinning World, Domedriver and Six Perfections, European Classic scorers Dream Well, Sulamani and Divine Proportions as well as Bago, who landed the 2004 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Alan Cooper, whose father Tom bought four Derby winners as yearlings, is the Niarchos racing manager, while Tim Richardson, whose brother Chris manages Cheveley Park Stud, is in charge of their breeding operation, based at Haras de Fresnay-Le-Buffard in Normandy and at Oak Tree Farm in Kentucky. The Niarchos family have around 65 horses in training spread between France, Britain and America with a 70-strong broodmare band.

No previous Ladbrokes St Leger wins

David Lanigan

David Lanigan was born on July 16, 1975, and is the son of Bob Lanigan, who is the former manager of Coolmore Stud in County Tipperary and - with wife Deidre - now owns the successful Tullamaine Castle Stud near Fethard. David Lanigan spent his school holidays riding out for the likes of Vincent O'Brien, John Oxx and Edward O'Grady, and after completing a degree at the Royal Agricultural College at Cirencester, headed across the Atlantic to work at John Jones' Walmac International, where he handled stallions such as Alleged, Nureyev and Miswaki. After five years in Kentucky, he returned to Britain in November, 2002, to begin a five-year spell as assistant to Henry Cecil, where he was involved in the preparation of 2007 Investec Oaks winner Light Shift. He took out a training licence in October, 2007, at Revida Place in Newmarket, but moved to Bjorn Nielsen's Kingsdown Stables in Upper Lambourn in December, 2011. Lanigan boasts high-profile owners such as John Magnier, the Niarchos Family, Nielsen, Lord Lloyd-Webber, Ben Sangster, Catesby Clay and several Dubai-based associates of the Maktoum family. Lanigan came close to Epsom Classic success when Meeznah was second in the 2010 Investec Oaks and although she was subsequently disqualified, she won two Group races last season including the Group Two Park Hill Stakes at Doncaster in September. Lanigan has enjoyed a good start at his new base in Lambourn winning the Group Three Lingfield Derby Trial with Main Sequence, before saddling the son of Aldebaran to finish second in the Investec Derby in June - his first runner in the Epsom Classic.

Ted Durcan

Born in Co Mayo, Ireland, on February 25, 1973, Ted Durcan hailed from a family of lawyers and went to a boarding school in Naas before becoming apprenticed to Jim Bolger for six years, spending two years as a work rider and sharing a house with Tony McCoy and leading Irish trainer David Wachman. He served the final year of his apprenticeship in Britain with Jack Berry at Cockerham in Lancashire and he went on to enjoy considerable success in Dubai where he has been champion jockey seven times. He rode for the first time in Dubai in the 1997/98 season, as number two rider behind Paul Eddery at Paddy Rudkin's stable, and impressed Sheikh Rashid bin Mohammed Al Maktoum, who offered him a retainer for the 1999/2000 season when he became champion rider for the first time with 58 successes, with wins including the Godolphin Mile on Conflict and Dubai Duty Free on Rhythm Band. Durcan, whose wife Sue works for Godolphin, enjoyed his best season in Britain in 2007 with 95 wins. Durcan now rides primarily for David Lanigan although it was Mick Channon who provided him with his first two Royal Ascot wins in 2005 with Flashy Wings and Championship Point, as well as the Group One Prix Morny victor Silca's Sister. The biggest win of his career so far came in the 2007 Investec Oaks at Epsom, where he partnered the Henry Cecil-trained Light Shift to victory and had a second Classic success when Godolphin's Mastery won the 2009 Ladbrokes St Leger. He also won the Group One Sprint Cup at Haydock twice for trainer Tim Easterby - on Pipalong in 2000 and Somnus in 2003. His most recent Group One success was aboard the Rod Collet-trained Saphresa in the Sun Chariot Stakes at Newmarket in October, 2009.

Thought Worthy

George Strawbridge's Diesis mare Vignette has already produced one British Classic winner in the 2007 Ladbrokes St Leger hero and Investec Derby fourth Lucarno and that colt's full-brother Thought Worthy boasts many similarities with his sibling. Both colts headed to Epsom Downs on the back of a victory in Newmarket's Listed Fairway Stakes although Lucarno's three and a half length winning margin was rather more comfortable than the neck by which Thought Worthy beat Frankel's full-brother Noble Mission on May 19. Thought Worthy won his only start at two, when seeing off a dozen rivals in a mile maiden at Newcastle on October 11, and performed creditably on his seasonal comeback at Sandown on April 28. Running in the Group Three bet365.com Classic Trial, he ploughed through heavy ground to finish runner-up to Imperial Monarch, who had taken the outside rail throughout the race. In the Investec Derby he proved no match for Camelot and after taking up the running turning for home, he finished 11 lengths adrift in fourth. He followed that up with a disappointing effort at Royal Ascot in the Group Two King Edward VII Stakes when fourth of the five runners but bounced back to his best after a two-month break in the Group Two Neptune Investment Management Great Voltigeur Stakes at York on August 22. He dictated a steady gallop under William Buick and showed a tenacious attitude to repel favourite Main Sequence by a neck.

George Strawbridge

George Strawbridge Jr was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on October 10, 1937, and is the grandson of Dr John Dorrance, who developed the soup condensation process. Strawbridge sits on the board of the Campbell Soup Co. and is on the board of trustees at Widener University, of which he is a former adjunct professor of Latin American History. He has a PhD from the University of Pennsylvania. A member of the US Jockey Club since 1976, he co-founded and has served as president and chairman of the National Steeplechase Association. Racing as Augustin Stable, he is the all-time leading money-winning steeplechase owner in America and rode many winners as an amateur. He owns the 700-plus acre Derry Meeting Farm, near his home in Cochranville, Pennsylvania, where he keeps most of his 50-strong broodmare band. He also has a team of mares in Europe, where his bloodstock is managed by agent James Wigan. While his racing interest began with jumping, Strawbridge gradually turned his attention to the Flat, enjoying big-race success with the mare Waya, who won an Eclipse Award in 1979 following three Grade One victories. His first major European home-bred success came via Treizieme who won the 1983 Grand Criterium at Longchamp, while the nervous but highly-talented Silver Fling, triumphed in his colours in the Prix de l'Abbaye at Longchamp in 1989. Despite battling with abdominal cancer in the early 1990s, Strawbridge continued to support his racing interests and he enjoyed major victories with European champion miler Selkirk, Irish and French St Leger winner Turgeon, and the 1994 Breeders' Cup Turf winner Tikkanen. His many other notable performers include five-time US Grade One winner With Anticipation, 1995 Epsom Derby third Presenting, Sleeping Indian, Ristna, Montare as well as US Hall Of Fame steeplechaser and two-time champion (1977 & 1978) Caféé Prince, 2001 steeplechase champion Pompeyo, 2008 US turf female Eclipse Award winner Forever Together and 2009 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint winner Informed Decision. He had a first British Classic victory with Lucarno in the 2007 Ladbrokes St Leger while Rainbow View won the 2008 Fillies' Mile and 2009 Matron Stakes. Last season's highpoint was provided by the Freddy Head-trained Moonlight Cloud winning the Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville and she completed the feat again this year with a similarly impressive display. Strawbridge enjoyed his first Royal Ascot success this year when Melbourne Cup hope Gatewood surged to victory in the Listed Wolferton Handicap. His main American trainer is Jonathan Sheppard while in Europe he has horses with John Gosden, Andrew Balding and Freddy Head. He was involved with the NHL ice-hockey club Buffalo Sabres for over 30 years, with stable stars Tikkanen and Turgeon named after players, while he also founded the Tampa Bay Rowdies soccer franchise in 1975. He was elected a member of the US Jockey Club in 1976 and is also a member of the Jockey Club of Canada and an honorary British Jockey Club member. Strawbridge has sons George III, Andrew and Stewart, as well as stepdaughters Sanna Hendricks and Kathy McKenna, who are both jump trainers. Sanna trained the 2007 Maryland Hunt Cup winner, The Bruce, who was owned by George Jr and ridden by Stewart.

John Gosden

John Gosden was born on March 30, 1951, the son of respected trainer Towser Gosden. Educated at Eastbourne College and Cambridge University, he worked in land management in Venezuela before returning to Britain to become assistant to Sir Noel Murless from 1974 to 1975 and then Vincent O'Brien from 1976 to 1977. After a brief period assisting Tommy Doyle in California, Gosden set up on his own in the States in 1979 and enjoyed a very successful nine years training on the west coast. He was responsible for saddling Bates Motel to win the Santa Anita, Monmouth and San Antonio Handicaps and also sent out the Robert Sangster-owned Royal Heroine to take the inaugural Breeders' Cup Mile at Hollywood Park in 1984 - both horses won Eclipse Awards. In 1988 he took out his first licence in Britain at the instigation of Sheikh Mohammed and established himself as a leading trainer on these shores at Newmarket, having his best season in 1992 when he recorded 113 British wins. The 1996 Ladbrokes St Leger was a seminal moment in the trainer's career as it marked his first English Classic success when the Sheikh Mohammed-owned Shantou collared Dushyantor to win at Doncaster. Gosden gained another success in Britain's oldest Classic 11 years on with Lucarno, who was bred and owned by another of his leading patrons, George Strawbridge. He won the race for a third time in 2010 with Arctic Cosmos, part-owned by his wife Rachel Hood, while Masked Marvel completed rare back-to-back wins last season, breaking the track record in the process. The trainer also has a good record in the Investec Derby, filling two of the places in 1995, training Shantou to finish third in 1996 and then having a first success in the Epsom Downs Classic courtesy of Benny The Dip in 1997. His other British Classic success was with Lahan in the QIPCO 1,000 Guineas at Newmarket in 2000, the first season that he trained at the famous Manton Estate in Wiltshire. He was previously based at Newmarket in Stanley House Stables owned by Sheikh Mohammed and returned to headquarters after the 2005 season and is now settled at Clarendon Stables on the Bury Road. Other good horses to have been trained by Gosden include the champion sprinter Oasis Dream, Irish Champion Stakes winner Muhtarram, Queen Elizabeth II Stakes victor Observatory, Prix Maurice de Gheest heroine May Ball, Golden Jubilee Stakes scorer Malhub, Coronation Stakes victor Nannina and Challenge Stakes winner Sleeping Indian. In 2008, Raven's Pass won the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes at Ascot and the Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita, Rainbow View easily captured the Group One Fillies' Mile at Ascot and Donatium took the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Santa Anita. Another Breeders' Cup success came in 2009 when Pounced won the Juvenile Turf, while Debussy enjoyed Stateside success in 2010, winning the Arlington Million. Dar Re Mi landed three top-flight wins for Gosden in 2009/10 including the Yorkshire Oaks and the Dubai Sheema Classic. On top of Masked Marvel's Ladbrokes St Leger success in 2011, Gosden landed his first King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Stakes with Nathaniel, Duncan gained a deserved victory at Group One level in the Irish St Leger, and Elusive Kate scored in the Group One Prix Marcel Boussac. The current season has continued in a similar vein, with Nathaniel taking the Coral-Eclipse and Izzi Top capturing the Pretty Polly Stakes in Ireland. Gosden enjoyed more success in Ireland with Great Heavens, who stormed to victory in the Irish Oaks, while Elusive Kate annexed the Group One Prix Rothschild in France and The Fugue gained a decisive victory in the Group One Nassau Stakes at Goodwood. JAPAN RACING ASSOCIATION SCEPTRE STAKES HISTORY

First run in 1982, the Japan Racing Association Sceptre Stakes honours one of the greatest fillies of all time, the remarkable Sceptre. In winning the 1902 St Leger at Doncaster, the great race mare became the only horse to win four British Classics, having annexed the 1,000 Guineas, 2,000 Guineas and Oaks. Her only Classic reversal came in that year's Derby when she was left at the start and finished fourth to Ard Patrick.

Initially staged over a mile for fillies and mares aged three and up, the Sceptre Stakes race distance was cut to seven furlongs in 1993. It attained Listed status in 1985 and was upgraded to Group Three level ahead of the 2011 renewal.

Luca Cumani trained Triple Tipple to win the inaugural contest under Greville Starkey and the handler struck again in 1984 thanks to Capricorn Belle. Cumani notched a further triumph in 2009 with Fantasia.

The most successful trainer in the race's history is Barry Hills, who retired in August, 2011, with five Sceptre Stakes victories to his name. Asteroid Field in 1986 was the first, followed by My Branch (1996), Mamounia (2002), Tantina (2003) and Royal Confidence (2008). As a broodmare, My Branch produced Group One Haydock Sprint Cup heroine Tante Rose.

Cherry Ridge, ridden by Willie Carson for trainer Geoff Wragg, won the first Listed running of the race in 1985 and the rider was again in the hot seat when the John Gosden-trained Arjuzah landed the spoils in 1993, the initial seven-furlong renewal. Carson notched four successes in the race, the other two coming aboard Tabdea (1990) and Perfect Circle (1992), making him the equal winning-most jockey alongside Michael Hills (1996 My Branch, 2002 Mamounia, 2003 Tantina, 2008 Royal Confidence).

Three-year-olds have by far the best record in the race with 24 of the 29 contests (there was no race in 1989) falling to the Classic generation. The first older filly to succeed was the four-year-old You Know The Rules in 1991, ridden by Lester Piggott for trainer Mick Channon.

A second four-year-old, Auntie Jane, triumphed in 1997, while five-year-olds have prevailed twice thanks to Nice One Clare (2001) and Favourable Terms (2005). One six-year-old has succeeded, the Mark Johnston-trained Branston Abby (1995).

The Sir Michael Stoute-trained Favourable Terms won the Sceptre Stakes, having captured the Group One Nassau Stakes the previous year and the trainer's Susu, successful in 1999, added the Group Two Challenge Stakes on her next outing. Nice One Clare, trained by Pip Payne, was another who used the Sceptre Stakes as a springboard to Group Two glory as she annexed the Group Two Diadem Stakes next time out in 2001.

The 2011 renewal, the first to be run at Group Three level, went to Irish raider Alanza. Trained by John Oxx and owned by the Aga Khan, Alanza scored by a neck from the 2010 heroine Dever Dream.

DFS PARK HILL STAKES HISTORY

Often referred to as “the fillies’ St Leger”, the DFS Park Hill Stakes was established in 1839 for three-year-old fillies over the St Leger distance which was then one mile, six furlongs and 127 yards. The race was opened up to older fillies and mares in 1990.

The first older filly to succeed was the John Gosden-trained Anna Of Saxony, who prevailed for owner Sheikh Mohammed and jockey Frankie Dettori in 1993.

The first running of this contest went to the John Scott-trained Mickleton Maid. Scott went on to saddle seven winners of the race in all, a record matched only by Sir Noel Murless. Sir Henry Cecil, with five wins on the board, is the winning-most current trainer. Cecil's latest victory came in 1996 when Eva Luna won as 2/1 favourite.

The great Blink Bonny won in 1857 after her victories in the Derby and Oaks. The William l’Anson-trained mare was odds-on favourite for the St Leger but was pulled by her unscrupulous jockey Charlton. Her Park Hill victory came in a faster time than that year’s St Leger.

Another legend of the Turf, Pretty Polly, won at the prohibitive odds of 1/25 in 1904 and is the shortest-priced winner of the Park Hill Stakes. Pretty Polly also won the fillies’ Triple Crown of 1,000 Guineas, Oaks and St Leger.

A total of 11 fillies have completed the Oaks/Park Hill Stakes double. Lady Evelyn was the first in 1849 and has been followed by Brown Duchess (1861), Marie Stuart (1873), Jannette (1878), Miss Jummy (1886), Amiable (1894), Canterbury Pilgrim (1896), Pretty Polly (1904), Love In Idleness (1921), Brownhylda (1923) and Pia (1967).

No filly or mare has prevailed at a longer price than Collyria, who was 33/1 when scoring for Murless and jockey Eph Smith in 1959.

Dettori is the most successful current rider with four triumphs, the other three wins coming aboard Noble Rose (1995), Echoes In Eternity (2004) and Meeznah (2011). That total is two less than the record six wins by a jockey, shared jointly by Sim Templeman and John Osborne Jr. Templeman’s first triumph came aboard Calypso in 1840, while Osborne, a Yorkshire favourite who rode from 1846 to 1892 and was renowned for his incorruptibility, partnered his first Park Hill winner Qui Vive in 1859 and his last, Minthe, in 1889.

The Park Hill Stakes was upgraded from Group Three status to Group Two ahead of the 2004 contest won by Godolphin’s Echoes In Eternity.

Sir Michael Stoute has saddled two of the last five winners. Hi Calypso progressed from being a 73-rated handicapper to land the prize in 2007, while stablemate Allegretto prevailed by six lengths in 2008. Allegretto was a top-class stayer, having won the Group Two Goodwood Cup and Group One Prix Royal Oak in 2007.

The Miniver Rose was a shock 28/1 winner in 2009 for trainer Richard Hannon and jockey Pat Dobbs, while the 2010 renewal went to the Mark Johnston-trained Eastern Aria.

Last year’s renewal was won by Meeznah, giving trainer David Lanigan his first success in the race while it was a fourth victory for Dettori.

BARRETT STEEL MAY HILL STAKES HISTORY

The Barrett Steel May Hill Stakes was initially run as a Group Three race in 1976 when Triple First prevailed for trainer Sir Michael Stoute. The race is named after May Hill, winner of the 1975 Park Hill Stakes at Doncaster as well as the Yorkshire Oaks at York.

The May Hill Stakes was upgraded to Group Two level in 2003 when Kinnaird took the spoils for North Yorkshire trainer Patrick Haslam. The filly went on to win the Group One Prix de l'Opera in 2005

The mile contest for juvenile fillies has been dominated by Sir Henry Cecil who has chalked up 12 victories, including four consecutive triumphs between 1986 and 1990, as well as a hat-trick between 1995 and 1997. His first win came in 1978 with Formulate, while his latest success was in 2001 when Half Glance prevailed.

Willie Carson's four victories aboard Tartan Pimpernel (1977), The Dancer (1979), Satinette (1983) and Majmu (1990) make him the joint most successful jockey in May Hill Stakes history. Frankie Dettori has also enjoyed four wins - Calando (1998), Teggiano (1999), White Moonstone (2010) and Lyric Of Light (2011).

Rainbow View, returned at 1/3 in 2008, is the shortest-priced winner of the race. Crowned the champion juvenile filly, John Gosden's charge won by two lengths from Snoqualmie Girl and then added the Group One Fillies' Mile to her season's tally.

Another short-priced winner was the Queen's Height Of Fashion who returned at 4/6 when successful in 1981 for trainer Dick Hern and jockey Joe Mercer. Three other odds-on shots have succeeded - Ever Genial at 10/11 in 1984, Tessa at 4/5 in 1988 and White Moonstone at 8/11 in 2010.

Height Of Fashion went on to win the Fillies' Mile at Ascot and the Princess Of Wales's Stakes at Newmarket before being sold to Hamdan Al Maktoum, for whom she became an outstanding broodmare producing the likes of Nashwan, Unfuwain and Nayef. Another winner, White Moonstone in 2010, also subsequently landed the Group One Fillies' Mile at Ascot.

Only one winner, Pollenator in 2009, has been returned at double-figure odds. The Richard Hannon-trained filly was a 14/1 chance when scoring by half a length from subsequent Group One winner Hibaayeb.

The race has produced two Oaks winners in Midway Lady (1985) and Reams Of Verse (1996), while the former also captured the 1,000 Guineas en route to Epsom success in 1986.

POLYPIPE FLYING CHILDERS STAKES HISTORY

This race for two-year-olds was founded in 1967 as the Norfolk Stakes. It took that name until 1973 when Ascot renamed the New Stakes to honour the Duke of Norfolk.

The Doncaster contest's title was changed to the Flying Childers Stakes. The 18th century champion, Flying Childers, owned by the Duke of Devonshire, was known in his day as the "fleetest horse that ever ran at Newmarket", so it is fitting that the race run in his honour is a five-furlong dash.

D'Urville, trained by Jeremy Tree, won the initial race at odds of 4/5 for jockey Jimmy Lindley. Hittite Glory sprang the biggest shock in the race's history in 1975 when scoring at 100/1 under Frankie Durr.

The brilliant Marwell won the Flying Childers in 1980 and went on to further success in the Cheveley Park Stakes at Newmarket before being crowned champion two-year-old filly. The Michael Stoute-trained filly became champion sprinter in France. In that 1981 season, she captured the Kings' Stand Stakes, July Cup and Prix de l'Abbaye. Marwell produced another great filly at stud in Marling, the 1991 champion two-year-old filly and 1992 champion miler.

Stoute's five wins in the race make him the trainer with the most successes in the Flying Childers Stakes. His victories have come through Music Maestro (1977), Marwell (1980), Green Desert (1985), Raah Algharb (1994) and Saddam (2001).

Lester Piggott is the most successful rider in the race's history, having captured the prize five times between 1969 (Tribal Chief) and 1985 (Green Desert). Piggott's son-in-law William Haggas trained the 2000 winner Superstar Leo.

Tribal Chief, at 4/11, is the equal shortest-priced winner along with Marwell, who was ridden to victory by jockey Greville Starkey.

Three Irish-trained horses have carried off the prize. The Dermot Weld-trained Hot Spark scored under Piggott in 1974 and Eddie Hide partnered the Vincent O'Brien-trained Peterhof in 1981. In 2011, the David Wachman-trained Requito became the first Irish-trained victor for 30 years.

The Flying Childers has been sponsored by Doncaster-based company, Polypipe, since 1996.

The speedy grey Paris House won for trainer Jack Berry in 1991, having previously chased home champion sprinter Sheikh Albadou in the all-age Group One Nunthorpe Stakes at York. Berry was enjoying back-to-back successes as he had saddled Distinctly North to victory the previous year.

Fleeting Spirit was another excellent winner in 2007. The Jeremy Noseda-trained filly blitzed some of the world's best sprinters when taking the 2009 July Cup at Newmarket.

Kevin Ryan saddled his second Polypipe Flying Childers winner in three years when Madame Trop Vite (2008) followed Wi Dud's (2006) success. The filly defeated subsequent King's Stand Stakes runner-up Anglezarke, with future Group One-winning miler Lord Shanakill in fifth.

Sand Vixen broke the juvenile course record when scoring in 2009 for the Maktoum family's Godolphin operation, with a time of 58.10 seconds, while the 2010 renewal went to Zebedee, who was retired to stand as a stallion after his Doncaster success.

STOBART DONCASTER CUP HISTORY

First run in 1766, the Group Two Stobart Doncaster Cup is the oldest race that still takes place under the Rules of Racing and is one of the highlights of the season at Doncaster.

The two-and-a-quarter mile contest is the final leg of the historic Stayers' Triple Crown that also incorporates the Gold Cup at Royal Ascot and the Goodwood Cup at Glorious Goodwood.

The race has been staged over two and a quarter miles since 1926, having taken place over various distances of around four miles up to 1824, two miles and five furlongs from 1825 to 1890 and two miles, one furlong from 1908 until 1926.

Many of the Turf's finest stayers have landed the historic prize and the most recent to clinch the Stayers' Triple Crown on Town Moor was the great Double Trigger in 1995.

Trained in Middleham by Mark Johnston, "Trigger" captured the Doncaster Cup on three occasions, gaining back-to-back triumphs in 1995 and 1996 before finishing fourth to Canon Can in 1997 and then reclaiming his title in 1998.

The first dual winner of the 19th century was the John Scott-trained Touchstone (1835 & 1836), while the great mare Beeswing won the race a remarkable four times. Having prevailed in 1837, the darling of the north returned triumphant in 1840, 1841 and 1842.

There have been seven dual winners since 1801. As well as Touchstone, Alice Hawthorne (1843/44) and Vedette (1857/58) achieved the feat in the 19th century, while Velocity proved too quick for his challengers in 1907 and 1908, the Queen's Agreement triumphed in 1958 and 1959, the brilliant Le Moss reigned supreme in 1979 and 1980, and Millenary bagged two wins in 2004 and 2005.

Volteigneur, Lord Zetland's brilliant colt, won the Derby and the Doncaster Cup in 1850 and the following year's Epsom hero, Teddington, completed the double when winning the Town Moor contest in 1852. In 1863, Macaroni won both races in the same season, as did Kettledrum in 1861.

The most recent Derby winner to carry off the Doncaster Cup was Lemberg who took the Town Moor race in 1911, having won the Epsom Classic in 1910.

The 2011 hero Saddler's Rock was the latest three-year-old to take the DFS Doncaster Cup. A total of 18 horses of Classic age have been successful since 1900.

Double Trigger was a four-year-old when clinching his first success and, since 1900, more horses of that age have prevailed than any other, with 47 horses aged four carrying off the prize.

The oldest winner in that period is Persian Punch, who was 10 when taking the spoils in 2003 – the year the race became a Group Two contest. He outdid his old rival Millenary, winner of the 2000 Ladbrokes St Leger, who was eight when winning the Doncaster Cup for a second time in 2005.

Seven horses, including Sergeant Cecil (2006), Boreas (2002), Millenary and Double Trigger, have won the race as seven-year-olds since 1900.

Joe Mercer, with eight victories between 1953 and Le Moss' second triumph in 1980, is the winning-most rider in the history of the race.

The most successful current jockey is Johnny Murtagh with three wins. Murtagh, successful on Septimus in 2007, also partnered Kasthari (2004, in a dead-heat with Millenary) and Enzeli (2000).

Cecil Boyd-Rochfort, with seven successes, has more wins on the roll of honour than any other trainer, commencing in 1934 with Alcazar and culminating in 1963 with Raise You Ten. His stepson, Sir Henry Cecil, is next on the list with six victories, the latest being Canon Can in 1997.

There have been three dead-heats. As well as Kasthari and Millenary in 2004, Merry Gal and Sidus were inseparable in 1901, while Souepi and Nick La Rocca passed the post in tandem in 1953.

The biggest field to line up is 15 in 1834 when Tomboy won. A post-19th century record of 11 runners went to post in 2000 when Enzeli saw off his rivals. The previous highest number of runners came in 1990 when Al Maheb defeated nine opponents.

There have been four occasions since 1900 when only two runners started. Prince Palatine (1912), winner of the previous year's St Leger, Long Set (1913), Colorado Kid (1933) and Exar (1960) each held off one rival.

At 1/20, Prince Palatine is the shortest-priced winner, while 33/1 shot Shangamuzo returned the biggest odds in 1977 under Pat Eddery.

Possibly the unluckiest horse in the race's history is Petrizzo, who was first past the post in both 1984 and 1986, only to lose the race in the stewards' room on each occasion for causing interference.

Askar Tau gave trainer Marcus Tregoning and jockey Ryan Moore their first victories in the Doncaster Cup when scoring by a neck from Darley Sun in 2009. Six-year-old Samuel was the victorious horse in 2010, handing a first victory to both trainer John Gosden and jockey William Buick. The duo returned 24 hours later to take the Ladbrokes St Leger with Arctic Cosmos.

Irish trainer John Oxx successful with Enzeli in 2000, enjoyed a second success with Saddler's Rock in 2011.

OLBG PARK STAKES HISTORY

First run in 1978, the OLBG Park Stakes was staged over its current distance of seven furlongs until 1993 at which point it became a mile contest, reverting to its original distance in 2003. The race gained Group Three status in 1986 and was upgraded to Group Two in 2004.

The 2008 running was the first without any penalties for Group One or Group Two success, something which continues this year as part of the bid to have the Park Stakes promoted to Group One status.

Dual winners have dominated the roll of honour in recent years with Arabian Gleam, successful in 2007 and 2008, following hot on the heels of Iffraaj, who triumphed in 2005 and 2006. Iffraaj was successful for trainer Michael Jarvis on the first of those occasions before joining the Godolphin stable of trainer Saeed bin Suroor, for whom he prevailed a year later. That second success came at York during Doncaster's redevelopment. Bishop Of Cashel, trained by James Fanshawe and ridden by Walter Swinburn was the first dual winner of the race (1995/96).

The first running of the Park Stakes went to the Paul Kelleway-trained 33/1 shot Green Girl and no horse has returned at longer odds. The shortest-priced winner was the Henry Cecil-trained Salse who scored at 8/15 in 1988.

A total of three horses have won at odds-on, the others being 2,000 Guineas winner Known Fact (4/6) in 1980 and Iffraaj in 2006.

In 1993, four horses went off as 7/2 co-favourites and duly filled the first four berths with the Richard Hannon-trained Swing Low prevailing.

Willie Carson, with four wins, is the most successful jockey in the Park Stakes (1980 Known Fact, 1982 The Quiet Bidder, 1985 Lucky Ring & 1989 Gold Seam). Frankie Dettori is the winning-most current rider with three wins (1990 Green Line Express, 1998 Handsome Ridge & 2006 Iffraaj).

Major Dick Hern (1981 Kittyhawk, 1985 Lucky Ring & 1989 Gold Seam), Sir Michael Stoute (1982 The Quiet Bidder, 1994 Soviet Line & 2001 Tough Speed) and James Fanshawe (1995 & 1996 Bishop Of Cashel & 2003 Polar Ben) each have three wins on the board, more than any other trainers.

Hughie Morrison saddled the 2004 winner, Pastoral Pursuits. The 5/1 shot went on to Group One glory with a storming victory in the 2005 July Cup at Newmarket.

Duff took the 2009 contest for Ireland, with the Edward Lynam-trained six-year-old prevailing by a neck from Cat Junior, with Arabian Gleam third (and thus denied a third consecutive victory in the race). Duff returned in 2010 and ran his usual game race from the front before fading to take fourth to seven-year-old Balthazaar's Gift, the oldest winner alongside Duck Row in 2002 and the 2011 hero Premio Loco.

ONE CALL INSURANCE CHAMPAGNE STAKES HISTORY

First run in 1823, the One Call Insurance Champagne Stakes has always been a leading Classic pointer and was increased in distance from six to seven furlongs in 1961.

Previously open to all two-year-olds, the race was restricted to colts and geldings in 1988 when Prince Of Dance was victorious. The last successful filly was Ambergris in 1960 and other notable winners of the fairer sex include greats such as Beeswing (1835), La Fleche (1891) and Pretty Polly (1903).

Bill Scott rode the first two winners of the race (1823 Swiss & 1824 Memnon) and went on to secure nine victories in all. He has the most number of wins by a jockey followed by Willie Carson whose eight victories commenced with Otha in 1972 and culminated with Bahhare in 1996.

The most successful jockey currently riding is Frankie Dettori, who teamed up with trainer David Loder to notch a hat-trick with Noverre (2000), Dubai Destination (2001) and Almushahar (2002), before scoring on Poet's Voice in 2009 and Saamidd in 2010, both trained by Saeed bin Suroor. Noverre passed the post first in the Poule d'Essai des Poulains the following spring but was later disqualified. He made amends for that with victory in the Group One Sussex Stakes at Goodwood and ended the season as the champion three-year-old miler.

Dubai Destination won a vintage renewal in 2001 when quickening impressively to defeat the exceptional Rock Of Gibraltar. The winner raced only once the following season due to injury, while the runner-up won his next seven starts, all at Group One level. Dubai Destination returned to action as a four-year-old, winning the Group One Queen Anne Stakes at Royal Ascot.

Legendary Middleham trainer John Scott trained 10 winners, beginning with Swiss (1823), a feat matched by Mat Dawson whose initial victory came in 1864 with Zambesi, three years after Scott's final success with The Marquis. The Marquis subsequently won the St Leger in 1862. Dawson's 10th and last Champagne Stakes win came in 1893 when subsequent Derby winner Ladas was triumphant. Sir Henry Cecil is the most successful current trainer, with four victories.

The Aidan O'Brien-trained Westphalia landed the spoils in 2008 en route to a runner-up finish in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. The Ballydoyle colt subsequently finished third in both the Poule d'Essai des Poulains and the Prix du Jockey Club.

The race has produced three dead-heats. The first was in 1886 when Lord Zetland's Panzerschiff and Grandison, owned by Lord Ellesmere, were inseparable. Galangal and Vedriana crossed the line in tandem in 1904, while 2005's renewal saw the Terry Mills-trained Close To You joined in victory with Silent Times, trained by Eoghan O'Neill.

The third Aga Khan's Palestine, trained by Frank Butters and ridden to success by Gordon Richards in 1949, is the shortest-priced winner of the race. The colt, winner of the 2,000 Guineas the following spring, returned at odds of 1/9. In the 188-year history of the race, only 16 horses have won at double-figure odds. The longest priced winner was Ayah, a 20/1 shot in 1897. More recently, the Eoghan O'Neill-trained Vital Equine prevailed at 16/1 in 2006.
